Dear Parishioners,

We have reached this great time of the year where the parish community, the parents and volunteer catechists are extremely excited for the reception of the First Holy Eucharist of our Religious Education students. Like any other sacrament, the First Holy Communions of these young boys and girls are done in the Church in our Sunday Liturgies inasmuch as they belong to the community and the parish is welcoming them as they receive Jesus in His Most Holy Sacrament, the Eucharist. This Sunday at the 11:30 Mass, we are happy to witness our First Holy Communion candidates as they partake in Jesus' Sacred Banquet for the first time in Holy Communion. As one community of faith, let us pray for them, that they may continue to participate in our Sunday Worship and Thanksgiving, receiving Jesus with enthusiasm, peace and joy. Please include in your prayers, their parents, catechists, volunteers and our dedicated CCD staff as they patiently teach, form, direct and guide our young people to Jesus and His Church in their journey of faith. Congratulations to our First Communicants!

The Church celebrates today the 3rd Sunday of Easter and we hear again the resurrection of Jesus. Easter is too big a feast to celebrate just one day. We celebrate it for fifty days, and then we continue to celebrate it every Sunday when we gather in faith to meet our risen Lord in the Eucharist. The Gospel we have just read takes us back to Easter Sunday afternoon, Jesus appeared to two of his disciples. They were walking away from Jerusalem, discouraged and depressed over Jesus' death. Jesus walked with them, talked to them about the Scriptures, and when he broke bread with them they eventually recognized him. They came running back to the upper room to tell the others. In spite of the appearances in the early morning to women, to the two disciples, and to Peter, St. Luke tells us the apostles were "terribly frightened." Jesus assured them he was very much alive and very well. In fact he asked them: "Do you have anything here to eat?"

Whatever wonderful life-changing events we might think of, the Resurrection of Jesus is the most life-changing event ever. Because Jesus rose from the dead, evil, hatred and suffering have been overpowered. They still hang around inflicting difficulties on us, but their power has been broken down by the glory and triumph of the Resurrection. Because Jesus rose from the dead, death no longer has the last word over any of us. Death has been overcome by life, that is, eternal life. Death and evil will keep on trying to pull us down and destroy us, but in Christ Jesus we are raised up.

"Peace" was the first word of Jesus to the apostles. Our world is a totally distinct world now after Jesus' Resurrection. But if it continues to look the same to all of us, with evil and hatred and suffering, then maybe we who have been changed by the resurrection are not doing what Jesus said to do as we heard him say at the end of today's gospel: "You are witnesses of these things." This world-changing event has happened and we hope to share in its blessings as we bring those blessings to the world around us through the witnessing of our lives, our goodness, our love, our peace and joy. Amen.



## **Important Parish Information**

**Parish Registration** ... To be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish, it is necessary to be registered, and to show your presence and support by attendance at Mass and through the regular use of offertory envelopes.

If you have questions regarding Parish Registration, please call 732-938-5375 or email [frontoffice@sienachurch.org](mailto:frontoffice@sienachurch.org).

If you move or change addresses or parishes, please notify the Parish Office in a timely manner.

**Young adults** ...who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, **should register with the Parish under their own name**.

**Weddings** ... Please call the Parish Office **one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.)**.

**Baptisms** ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Prior to the birth of the child, attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents, and sponsors/godparents also are encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information, contact the parish office.

**Sponsorship** ... In order to be a sponsor/godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months**. One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
