

Dear Parishioners,

Today at the 11:30 Mass, we are going to have the Monday evening class of our Religious Education Program, for they are receiving the Eucharist for the first time in their lives. Let us rejoice and be glad for our young people of the parish as we witness them receiving Jesus, his body and soul and divinity, food that will nourish them physically and spiritually in Holy Communion. The First Eucharist has to be done with the congregation during Sunday Liturgies so that the faithful of the parish will welcome, support, and pray with these young boys and girls who are so enthused and excited on receiving Jesus for the first time. Congratulations!

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is designated by the Church as Good Shepherd Sunday. As we hear Jesus telling us: "I am the Good Shepherd." We have a passage from St. John's 10th chapter of his gospel (Jn. 10:11-18). Jesus is telling the Pharisees and us that there are two kinds of shepherds. There is the kind of shepherd who owns his or her sheep and there are shepherds who are hired by a farmer to protect and care for sheep that belong to someone else.

The second kind, the hired shepherds, run away when danger comes, while those who own their sheep fight hard to protect and care for what is their own, sometimes getting injured badly or even getting themselves killed. Jesus is telling us he would be killed to protect and save us, but he would return to life again, he promised, which he did. This clearly shows us, first of all, how much he cares for us. He would fight to the bitter end for us. It also manifests to us how powerful he is that he can lay down his life and take it up again.

Jesus tells us something else about shepherds today. They know their sheep and the sheep know their shepherds. It is just like we know our pets at home. How do they know one another very well. It is because they spend a lot of time together. Sheep take a lot of care and the shepherd is with his sheep twenty four hours a day, seven days a week. Jesus is with us all the time and knows us better than we know ourselves. In fact, Jesus knows all the hairs on our heads are numbered. Does anybody among ourselves know that? Now, if we don't know him very well, we need to spend more time with him in prayer.

If we apply this idea of good and bad shepherds to todays Church, we might conclude that there is a big challenge meant not only for priests and bishops. The truth is, it applies to all of us. We are all challenged to look into our hearts and judge the generosity of our people in and around us. Each of us, by virtue of Baptism, is called to share Good News and live faithfully the teachings of the Gospel. We are called by God to imitate Jesus, the Good Shepherd. He wants us to trust and follow him.

Sometimes, following him can get a little frightening because we don't know where he is taking us or what he might ask of us. But we have to trust him truly by living our lives full of compassion and concern for others. By living in this way, Jesus, our Good Shepherd can use us as an instrument of his love as we provide those around us with the chance to hear and respond to Jesus' call. Amen.



Important Parish Information

Parish Registration ... To be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish, it is necessary to be registered, and to show your presence and support by attendance at Mass and through the regular use of offertory envelopes.

If you have questions regarding Parish Registration, please call 732-938-5375 or email frontoffice@sienachurch.org.

If you move or change addresses or parishes, please notify the Parish Office in a timely manner.

Young adults ...who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, **should register with the Parish under their own name**.

Weddings ... Please call the Parish Office **one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.)**.

Baptisms ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Prior to the birth of the child, attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents, and sponsors/godparents also are encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information, contact the parish office.

Sponsorship ... In order to be a sponsor/godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months**. One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
