Dear Parishioners,

The parish community of St. Catherine welcomes our Missionary Priest, Rev. Father Cesar Echegaray. Father Cesar is the representative of the Most Rev. Jose Corazon Tala-oc, Bishop of the Diocese of Kalibo in the Philippines. I invite you to listen to him as he presents their missionary work and the plight of the less fortunate people in their diocese. As your pastor, I ask you to contribute to their mission with generosity and kindness as you help them with monetary participation and prayers. Please be generous. Thank you so much.

Last Sunday's Gospel reading talks about how Jesus fed in a miraculous way and how the people wanted to make him a king. The gospel for today is a surprise because we heard how the crowd challenged Jesus in order for them to believe in him.

What is going on here is that Jesus wanted the people to take him on his terms while the people were willing to take Jesus on their own terms but not on his. The people were approaching Jesus on a material, worldly level. As Jesus said, "you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves." It was not just a free fish dinner they are seeking; but they wanted a liberator, a king to free them from foreign conqueror, from the power of Rome and to establish their own freedom and independence. Jesus was trying to lift their level of thinking from a worldly, material level to a more spiritual one. He told them he fed them as a sign that he wanted to feed them with bread that comes down from heaven, from God himself, bread that would nourish them in eternal life.

However, those people did not see the meaning of the sign that Jesus did. There was much more to the sign than just the free meal. There was much more to the sign than the possibility that he could be the long awaited messiah, the one coming from above who could restore independence to their nation.

So as Jesus continued to teach them, he mentioned to them not to work for food that perishes but for the food that secures eternal life. Is Jesus telling them they do not need to work for food, shelter, clothing, security and other basic things? Should we all just sit around and pray and hang around and wait and depend on the government to take care of us?

Absolutely, this is not what Jesus is saying. He himself worked at skilled labor for almost all his life. Even the Apostle Paul said to the Thessalonians: "When we were with you, we instructed you, that if anyone is unwilling to work, neither should that one eat." Jesus is more than practical in telling us we have to look beyond devoting our time and energy only to our immediate needs. He reminds us to look to the future not only in this life but to our eternal future. As a former Superior General of the Jesuits throughout the world has said: "Nothing is more practical than finding God... What you are in love with, what seized your imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what will you do with your evenings, how you will spend your weekends, what you read, who you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything." Amen.

2015-2016 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

FALL REGISTRATION IS STILL OPEN. We are now taking registration for: students currently in our program that need to be re-enrolled, new siblings entering the program, and First graders starting the program. Please contact the Religious Education Office at 732-938-6229.

Every year our Diocese participates in the missionary cooperation program and invites missionaries throughout the world to share their work in the missions. This year our Diocese has chosen the Diocese of Kalibo in the Philippines. The missionary priest coming to preach this weekend is Rev. Cesar Echegaray. He will share his mission work and the plight of the poor in his diocese. He represents the Most Rev. Jose Corazon Tala-oc, D.D., on behalf of the Diocese of Kalibo. The purpose for this appeal is for the relief and rehabilitation of malnourished children and the poor, for the formation of lay leaders who will be sent to evangelize the unchurched in rural areas, and for the healing missions including medical, dental and optical for poor families who cannot afford health services, buy medicines and pay for hospitalization. Most of the poor villages and the unchurched are located in the rural areas and hinterlands. 75% of the population are workers in the rice field. They are visited by typhoons every year which destroy their crops and nipa/bamboo-made houses. Please be generous!
