

Dear Parishioners,

Being around in the priesthood for almost four decades, ministering in different places and attending to the spiritual, physical, emotional, psychological as well as behavioral needs of the people I serve, I find it is so difficult and challenging to make decisions. From my own learning experience, I turn to those people I trust and most importantly to Jesus, the Eternal High Priest, the God Almighty.

Today as we celebrate the Twenty First Sunday of the Year our readings are all about making decisions. How we make them, why we make them, and how we stick by them. In the first reading, Joshua lays it on the line before the Israelites: Which god are you going to serve? Make up your minds.

Obviously, it was not an easy decision. The God of Abraham and Moses was one who demanded obedience, expected courage and sacrifice, and called them to live lives of righteousness and justice. The pagan peoples around them had no such god because their way of life was easier and sometimes looked more attractive. But as we have heard, the Israelites decided to stick with the God who had brought them out of slavery in Egypt, fed them in the desert, and was now leading them to freedom in the promised land.

Saint Paul talks about a huge decision that is all about marriage in the second reading. He tells husbands and wives to stand by each other, to love each other the way Christ loves the Church. And that's a big mandate and order: for today it is too much for many people. Why? Men and women are afraid to have a commitment to each other in the sacrament of matrimony, so they make other arrangements. And those who do marry have a hard time staying together. And the Apostle Paul says, if you really love each other, make your decision. Make your vows and promises before God, and stand firm by them, and in return God will stand by you.

In the Gospel we heard, Jesus tells his followers things they find so hard to accept. He says he will give them his flesh to eat and his blood to drink. When they draw back, he doesn't change his message to please his listeners. He tells them to make up their minds. Either follow him or leave him. So the crowd melted away. Then he asks the Twelve Apostles: "Do you also want to leave?" Peter doesn't answer. But he says, "Master to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Peter has shown us how to make decisions. He is a good role model in making up our minds. For he doesn't believe in something. He believes in Someone. Faithful wives and husbands do not believe in marriage, but believe in each other. We don't believe in religion; we believe in God. We do not believe in Christianity; we believe in Jesus Christ. To whom else shall we go? He has the words of eternal life. Can you remember and recall a time when your faith in God obliged you to make a big decision? How did you respond to it?

This beautiful chapel holds about 450 people and will be an appropriate setting for this Mass as the sun sets over the Jersey shoreline. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. Sponsorship ... In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months.** One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
