Dear Parishioners,

As your Pastor, I would like to express my appreciation and gratitude for your excellent support of the 2014 Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal. We were successful in responding to the responsibility of putting our faith into action, being mindful not only of our own parish community but of the bigger community as well to which we belong. A special word of thanks to Donna Lee who is our Coordinator for the project. Her dedication and hard work makes a big difference for she put in a lot of time and effort to make it a success. Thanks very much Donna.

This weekend we are going to hear from Father Al and myself speaking at all the Masses as we kick off the 2015 Annual Catholic Appeal. Let's listen and be prayerful as we participate and ask for your active participation on this endeavor. We are asking for more donors and contributors in order to respond to the Diocese's financial help. We ask for your prayers also as we would like to reach our goal of \$44,000 this year or exceed our goal so that our parish would get some share from the appeal.

I would like you to pay attention to the Knights of Columbus as they speak at all the Masses this weekend. They are Catholic men who are doing so great when it comes to our faith and religion. Today at Mass we celebrate a love that reaches out to us, a love that is unconditional, infinite, a love that is willing to come down to us from his throne on high as the Son of God and put on the weakness of our humanness. A love that was powerful enough to heal the sick and raise the dead to life. A love that restored to a poor leper not only his health, but his home and family. In so doing he made himself unclean by Jewish law because he touched a leper and made himself unable to be in the company of others. His is a love that is willing to give everything to those he loved, even his own life. Nevertheless, the Good News is that the evil powers that took his life did not succeed. His love was too powerful to be crushed. And in his love he continues to give himself as food and drink for those who believe in him; not just any food or drink but a food and drink that will give eternal life.

In the Eucharistic liturgy, we come to the source and origin of all love with our own frailties, failures and sins that get in the way of our own ability to love. With the pain we have caused and with the marks and scars from wounds inflicted on us, we ask for healing. Wherever we need healing, in our physical bodies, in our broken hearts, in our ability to be more loving toward others, we ask the Lord to reach out and touch us and we pray for healing.

The 18th of February is Ash Wednesday. It marks the beginning of the liturgical season of penance in preparation for Easter. During the forty days that begin with Ash Wednesday and conclude on Holy Thursday, we are encouraged to engage in penitential acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, in order to heighten our spiritual life and draw us closer to God.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"These forty days of Lent, O Lord, with you we fast and pray." This line from a popular hymn we sing in our parishes during the season of Lent contains a very important truth. During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from **Ash Wednesday, February 18**th **until Holy Thursday, April 2**nd --- it is with YOU, Lord, with YOU we fast and pray. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience of the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. "With YOU we fast and pray" is our song. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. "With YOU, too, we fast and pray." Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States asks of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of **fast (only one full meal) and abstinence (no meat)** are **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**

All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to abstain (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of days, which must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22**nd to **Trinity Sunday, May 31**st. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage Catholics to get to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance, grace and joy for us all.

Act Now to Stop Assisted Suicide S382, a bill authorizing doctor prescribed suicide, was released by the Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee on December 15, 2014 and could be voted on by the full Senate at any time. An identical bill, A2270 was passed by the General Assembly on November 13, 2014. S382, the Aid in Dying for the Terminally Ill Act, has great potential for serious abuses. For example, the bill does not allow for human error, which so often occurs. In predicting patients' lifespans, a 6-month prognosis for a terminal illness is often wildly inaccurate. Also, S382 does not require a patient to consult a psychiatrist, palliative care, or hospice expert before receiving and administering the prescription to commit suicide. Under S382 no physician is required to be present when the patient takes the lethal prescription and there is no requirement to notify family members. We should support compassionate care, especially improved hospice and palliative care. We should not assist people to commit suicide. Please contact your Senator and ask them to vote "No" on S382 - the Aid in dying for the Terminally Ill Act. This is very easy to do by email at https://votervoice.net/NJCC/Campaigns.
