#### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel. Dear Parishioners,

This week we have to pay special attention to the Catholic Education of our young people as we celebrate Catholic School week. Everyone is asked to support and pray for our Catholic Schools. Keep in mind that we as a parish community are financially supporting those Catholic Schools within our Diocese and that is what we call co-sponsorship of Catholic Education.

This Sunday we celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Some words we use in the English language originated from Greek words, for instance the word time is called Chronos. There is chronology, chronicle and even chronic which refers to something that lasts a long time. Chronos tells us what time it is. For example, January 15, 2015 at 2:00 PM. There is the second Greek word for time and that is Kairos, which means what we might call occasion or opportunity. It tells us what time it is for. For example, it's what a mommy might mean when she reminds her son "it's time for you to clean up your room." Or some people might start thinking if I get too long with my homily, etc.

In the 1st reading it was time for the people of Nineveh to reform their lives and do penance. St. Paul in the 2nd reading tells that "time is running out." He was encouraging the community of Corinth to be detached from the things of this world, even marital love, because he expected the 2nd and final coming of Christ to happen in a very short time. Of course it did not happen. However, although we do not know when it will happen. Paul's basic idea is true. We must not get so occupied with everyday concerns that we tend to forget about the life that is to come. Salvation is not automatic and we do not have forever to get ourselves ready for it. Never forget that it's not only those who have terminal sickness or aged people that die. We know from experience that death can come to any one at any given time. The only thing we can build our lives on that is reliable and permanent is the life we hope to enjoy with God in eternity. As Jesus tells us "This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel." Similarly, Jesus uses the word Kairos when he said "This is the time. Now is the opportunity for grace. Now is the season to open ourselves to God's life. And this is a message for all of us to hear. Conversion is an ongoing thing. We all sin. We all tend to get lazy sometimes, we all tend to get our priorities out of order at times and put aside the most important things for things that are easier and more fun and enjoyable. We all have room to grow more in our faith. Opportunities, as we already know do not hang around forever. So it is now, not tomorrow, to open myself up to the life of Jesus and to the Gospel.

Perhaps the Lord is inviting us, as he did with his first Apostles to get across this message to others. You don't have to be a priest or religious to do this. Whoever you are, certainly, you can pray for the conversion of someone or perhaps you can even do more to help someone to come to the Lord.

So let me remind you that, the next time you take a look at your wrist watch, don't just see what time it is, but thank the Lord God for the precious gift of time and ask yourself, are you using it as best as you can. No time can outdo what we are doing right now, praying the highest form of prayer, the Mass.

**Parish Registration** ... To be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish, it is necessary to be registered, and to show your presence and support by attendance at Mass and through the regular use of offertory envelopes.

If you have questions regarding Parish Registration, please call 732-938-5375 or email frontoffice@sienachurch.org.

If you move or change addresses or parishes, please notify the Parish Office in a timely manner.

**Young adults** ...who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, **should register with the Parish under their own name.** 

<u>Weddings</u> ... Please call the Parish Office one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.).

**Baptisms** ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Prior to the birth of the child, attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents, and sponsors/godparents also are encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information, contact the parish office.

**Sponsorship** ... In order to be a sponsor/godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
