Dear Parishioners,

We have been waiting for the light to return, so the people of Israel waited for the light of a Messiah who would come and proclaim a new kingdom and give people the fulfillment of a promise. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany and it proclaims to us that Christ is the Messiah, the glory of God, who is like light breaking into the night and who gives a new hope and rebirth to the people that walked in darkness.

Let us imagine and come to the crib and look into the manger to see the Christ child lying in the feeding place for animals. He is our food for life. With childlike wonder we look into the crib and see the kings (magi) gathered to worship this child and bearing their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Those are gifts which are extravagant and fit for a king and God. The gift of myrrh is a sign of suffering and the anointing of the dead, hence a shadow falls over this scene of joy and hope. The fulfillment of the life of this child will be poured out on the cross so that we can have life, with our sins forgiven. Therefore the cross stands over this scene of Christmas and promises victory, hope and rebirth.

As we look at the visit of the magi, it tells us that God has opened up the doors of salvation to all but not everyone chooses to enter into God's kingdom. This beautiful story of the magi reminds us that we have to put in some time and energy to find God as we want to enter into eternal life. Entrance into eternal life does not come automatically. Even if we know our faith perfectly but we don't live it, then it's not enough. The magi came quite a distance, hundreds and hundreds of miles to find the child Jesus. They had to keep searching, even to the point of seeking assistance from king Herod and the indifferent Jewish clergy who had all the answers, but not enough interest in finding the messiah themselves. God's kingdom is for everyone, but not everyone comes looking for it, and only those who do find it.

After the hectic celebration of Christmas, this feast helps us to grasp more deeply the gift that has been given to us and the revelation of the Christ child who will save us. Pope Francis challenges us to share the joy of the Gospel with people we meet everyday. Perhaps we can help a friend to find new meaning in life because of the celebration of Christmas. The Feast of Epiphany invites us to find a new path and a new way as we begin the year. The message of the Gospel calls us to be more compassionate and open to people who are more vulnerable and fragile, weak and poor. Let us share our hope and joy with others. Amen.
