

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fourteenth Sunday of the Year. Isn't it true that there are times when we all put people up on a pedestal who end up letting us down, which disappoints us, and we have looked down upon people who we think are much better off than we are?

Let us look at Jesus' family, friends, and neighbors who thought they knew him. In their own calculation he was just one of them, a day worker who turned preacher. He didn't belong to the Priestly class or have an extensive formal education in Jerusalem like other religious leaders. Most probably a few of them were impressed, but a majority of them couldn't believe he was anyone who is so special, though there were many stories told about him and the incredible things he was doing. St. Mark tells us he couldn't do much to help any of them. This is a strong statement and we find it only in St. Mark's gospel: "he was not able to perform any mighty deeds there, apart from curing a few sick people." The message is clear and obvious: lack of faith prevents God from helping us, much as he would like to.

The lesson for all of us in this particular gospel is that we have to be careful not to tell ourselves who Jesus is. Or much better, we know some things about Jesus. We learned them from our parents, we learned them in school, we learned them in the Bible, we learned them in Church. We profess our faith and belief in Jesus every Sunday as we come to the Sunday liturgy, and so we think we know all about Jesus.

It was St. John of the Cross, a 16th century mystic who told us that no matter what we know about Jesus, it is just the beginning. For he said that Jesus is "like a rich mine with so many pockets containing a multitude of treasures, however, no matter how deep we dig we will never find their end nor their limit. Indeed, in every pocket new seams of fresh riches are discovered on all sides."

An interesting question is; How do we come to know who Jesus is? To build on our foundation, on what we already know, we constantly need prayer, the sacraments, most especially the Holy Eucharist, and being charitable to others. We have to keep in mind that we do need all of these three: prayers, sacraments and service to others.

One of the reasons why we are here today is to get to know Jesus better than we already do. This weekend we celebrate our Independence Day, our freedom. Some people think that freedom means doing whatever you want. Our present culture tells us, and more and more people think, that freedom means freedom from God and whatever God wants us to do or not to do. Statistics show how people nowadays are taking their religion less and less in their lives. Now this is the challenge, if you want to do something good for our nation, start inviting a friend who does not come to Church to come with you. Hopefully they will discover God's love more realistically and deeply. Let us be immensely grateful to God for the countless blessings he has granted us including our own country as we celebrate our Independence day.

Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Sponsors/godparents are also encouraged to attend. Sponsorship ...
