

Dear Parishioners,  
 As we enter another week, the young people of the parish are going to have a CAR WASH in our parking lot on Saturday, June 20, from 9 in the morning to 2 in the afternoon. It is good that your cars are being cleansed and at the same time you are supporting the Youth Group of the community for a great cause.

At next weekend's Masses, June 20-21, the Knights of Columbus are speaking to recruit more potential members as well as leaders of their organization. If you have any interesting concerns or questions, they are available to talk to you in the narthex of the Church after Mass.

This Sunday as we celebrate the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, I would like to start off our reflection with a story. A 19th century poet Dante Rossetti, a kind hearted man, was so considerate when an elderly man asked him if he would come and see some drawings he had done and tell him what his thoughts were. Rossetti at once agreed, but when the art work was put on a display before him he could see that it had no real artistic value. Hesitatingly, he had to tell the old man that the pictures had little value. The man's reaction showed he wasn't too surprised by the judgment, but he requested Rossetti if he would be so considerate to take a look at two or three other pictures before he went. They were, he exclaimed, the work of a young man and it would be good to get Rossetti's evaluation on them. At this time, Rossetti's reaction was unmistakable. "Oh yes," he said, these are very good, and full of promise. Tell me, who is this young artist; is he your son?" The old man responded negatively and he said, "it's me; I did them forty years ago. And if only someone had given me that kind of encouragement, I'd never lost interest and given up." Everybody, whether young or old, needs words of Encouragement and particularly with our spiritual life, namely our efforts to follow Jesus. It's so easy to get discouraged, to feel that we are no good, that we are making little or no progress at all.

The prophet Ezekiel, who gave us the first reading, lived at one of the most disastrous periods of Israel's history, when it's people had been hauled off into exile far away from their homeland and many were thinking that God has abandoned them. Prophet Ezekiel assures them that this is not so. On the other hand, the Lord God has a great plan for his people for he will pluck them up, like taking a tiny twig from a branch, and transplant them so that they will grow into a huge tree. That wonderful tree, though Ezekiel has no idea what it could be, stands as the a symbol of the kingdom of God.

This prophecy of Ezekiel is fulfilled in Jesus, who reveals God's kingdom on earth. God intentionally reaches out to all especially to those sinners. But in order to receive the kingdom, we must be open to God, to his word. In faith, the word is planted like a seed in our hearts where, by its own power, it grows until the harvest time. Amen.

**Baptisms** ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Sponsors/godparents are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. **Sponsorship** ... In order to be a sponsor/ godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months.** One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
