Dear Parishioners,

Our religious education students are going to have their Lenten Reconciliation events on March 16 and 18 respectively. We invite also their parents and guardians to join them at the Church for confessions. The parish has invited guest priests to help us hear confessions and give out absolution to them. The season of Lent is an opportunity to clean up our soul, body and spirit as we unite with Jesus in the wilderness to reflect, pray and fast.

Let us now look at the Gospel as we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Lent. Jesus goes on to say that his death and resurrection are the basis of the spiritual life to be revealed by him. The words "raised up" in John's Gospel refer to Jesus being raised up on the cross and his glorification in his resurrection and ascension. Jesus used an example to explain this so that Nicodemus would have understood. The example is taken from an event from the Book of Numbers where the Jews, in their journey through the desert, encountered a nest of poisonous snakes. Many were bitten with a painful bite and many died. God, however, has to find a solution and told Moses to make a bronze serpent and put it on a pole and all who looked upon it were cured, healed and saved.

And therefore, it is through Jesus' saving death and Resurrection, our faith in him, celebrated and fully expressed in the sacrament of Baptism and Eucharist, that we are saved. Jesus emphasized that he has come to redeem us simply because of God's great love and not because we deserved or earned it. But he reminds us that his love cannot save us if we do not open up ourselves to it. It is like the light of Jesus.

Are you walking in the light of Jesus' love? Or do you fear his light because of what it might reveal in the dark corners of your life, which like all of us, you try to keep hidden? Now today, in this hour, Jesus is calling you to put away fear. Come into the bright light of his love. Once you do that, the fire of Christ's love will burn out everything in you that is opposed to this light. Then the reason for your fear will be gone. Confidently, you will be safe, safe for this life and for all eternity.

So we heard the famous verse John 3:16, God so loved the world, God so loved you and me, that he sent his only son who died and rose to give us life. This is the new and everlasting covenant that God bestows on us. Let us recall that love and truly express our faith in his love as we celebrate the Eucharist with joy and enthusiasm. Amen.
