Dear Parishioners,

As your Pastor, I would like to express my thanks to each and every parishioner, to the ministries and to everyone else who has been so involved in our parish community. The flowers in the parish complex, in the Chapel and in the rectory are planted by our dedicated volunteers. Kudos to all of them.

This Sunday is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. We have to be mindful that we are dealing here with a mystery, a mystery which no one fully understands, at least not in this life, maybe in the next. Because it's a mystery of who God is and God is too great for our small minds to fully comprehend. And yet, this is a mystery we cannot just ignore because it is one of the basic foundations of our faith. Our understanding of Jesus as God's Son and our understanding of the Holy Spirit would be seriously flawed without our belief in the Holy Trinity. The Hebrew people learned from God that there were not many gods but only one, even though all the nations around them for centuries would believe differently. When Jesus came, God taught us more about who God is, a lot more. Today is a great time to pause and reflect on what we have learned as a follower of Jesus.

One thing we should be aware of by now is that God is a many-sided God like us. The other kids in school knew something about us, but they rarely knew us. They picked up on one or two characteristics, qualities they liked or disliked, admired or looked down on, and ended up with one sided incomplete portraits that didn't do us justice. Even then, we were more complicated than others gave us credit for.

As adults, some religious people who take God seriously find it hard to absorb and keep in balance what has been revealed about him. Moses tells us that God is our creator, lord, and judge. Some of the other prophets remind us that he is also our friend, lover, and companion. And Jesus goes so far as to call him "Abba," a Hebrew word for "Pop" or "Dad." So God is an awesome, majestic, all-powerful Being to whom we owe reverence and obedience. He is also loving and gentle and invites us to intimacy. For some they only remember the first part, and they have a religion of fear and guilt and not much else. Others remember only the second part, and they end up with a wimpy religion in which God's main job is to assure us that we are not junk, that he's okay and we're okay, that we should feel good about ourselves, that he likes us just the way we are and wouldn't want us to change a thing.

These one-dimensional views of God are bad for the Church too. People who know only the lawgiving, punishing God turn Church into a joyless place where they come to be scolded, threatened, and condemned. Those who prefer the politically correct, broadminded, undemanding God want Church to be nothing more than an emotional service station where they go just to feel good. This Feast of the Most Holy Trinity invites us to expect more and do better than that. We celebrate a many-sided, infinitely good and gracious God. He gives us life. He watches over us, comforts us, and enjoys us. He has great plans for us. He also worries about us, warns us, and challenges us. Does it sound like an ideal parent? Absolutely. That's why Jesus, our Brother, calls him Father for he gives us the Spirit to help us know him as he really is and respond to his tender and loving care. Amen.

Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Sponsors/godparents are also encouraged to attend. Sponsorship ... In order to be a sponsor/ godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months.** One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
