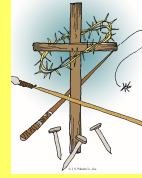

Dear Parishioners,

Today is World Mission Sunday and a celebration in our local church and throughout the world. This is a great opportunity for us to connect to them, through our solidarity of sacrifice with our good works and prayers across the entire world. Pope Francis reminds us, "Mission is part of the grammar of faith, something essential for those who listen to the voice of the Spirit who whispers Come and Go forth. Those who follow Christ cannot fail to be missionaries...." Let us support the Missions as we give our monetary contributions together with our sincere prayers.

Our parish community has established a tradition of gathering, camaraderie and friendship, with food and music and lots of fun as we start with the season of Fall. As it has been announced, we continue to invite and remind you, our Fall Harvest Festival is this Sunday from 11:30 AM to 3 PM in the Church's Parking Lot. Incidentally, we are asking your kind and generous heart to support our Coat Drive as you donate those jackets and coats for a great cause. The beneficiaries will be those people who need the warm clothes for the upcoming cold season. We thank those parishioners, most especially the Knights of Columbus for this great undertaking as they continue to sponsor this wonderful event. Thank you so much. Kudos to all of you.

Today we celebrate the 29th Sunday of the Year. James and John, the sons of Zebedee, were anxious to share the glory of Jesus in his kingdom. Obviously, they were idealistic young men who loved Jesus and were devoted to him. Clearly, they did not understand what they were asking for. They were ambitious and had no idea what Jesus was all about.

They thought Jesus was going to usher in a new social order, and they were making a move to get the top jobs, which meant power, authority and influence. Jesus tries to bring them down to earth: "Can you drink the cup that I drink?" With all the confidence of young men, they reply: "We can." But what he is asking is, Can you go through the most terrible things and experiences that I have to go through? Can you face being submerged in hatred and difficulties and death, as I have to be? He clearly tells them that without the cross there would be no crown. Eventually they would learn, that for followers of Christ, the way to greatness is through pain and suffering.

The lesson Jesus is teaching here is not just following him. It's about life. Too often, people want to do as little as possible and to get as much as possible. Only when we are willing to put more into life than we take out, will life for us and for others be happy and prosperous.

The world needs people whose ideal is service, not just for power and influence, the ones who realize that what Jesus is saying makes sense. "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant. He has shown this by his own example: "The Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many."

So in our own practical life, how can you imagine becoming great by being a servant? Can we think of anyone to inspire us in this way?

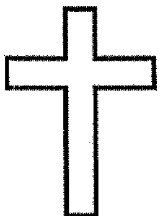

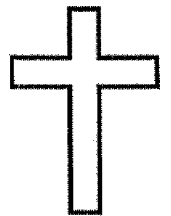

Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. Recommendation for Sponsorship ...
