Dear Parishioners,

I would like to look back at the result of the survey a few months ago for it continues to amaze and inspire me. One of the best results of the survey says that our parish Community, aside from being welcoming and friendly, responds to all of the appeals, either monetary or other things. Having noticed this wonderful result in our Church, I am incredibly proud of the generosity, responsiveness and sensitivity of our parishioners to others.

This Sunday is the Commitment Weekend of our Diocesan Fund Campaign. As a parish family we continue to seek your full support as we bring to closure the Faith to Move Mountains Campaign. We are reaching out to every parishioner who has yet to make their own gift or those who wish to make a pledge after initially refusing to do so. Instead of the homily that we normally do, allow me and Father Al to speak to you. It is an every member appeal.

As we have mentioned to you before, we are participating in a \$75 million endowment fund campaign. Most of you have recently received information from me that outlines the reason for the campaign, including how our own parish will benefit from it. Our parish goal is \$580,000 in three to five years so that it is more affordable and can have a great impact on the future of the Church. There is a 70/30 percent split from the Diocese and our own parish. We already have the case elements: St. Catherine of Siena Church Building, the Chapel and the Rectory. I will try to explain these further at my presentation at our Sunday Masses.

I will be making the wrap-up campaign by receiving 100% participation. As you pray about your gift decision, consider the lives that will be affected through your generosity. Thank you so much to those who have made their pledges already and I am looking forward to our faithful parishioners to join us in this effort.

As your Shepherd, I am happy to announce to the whole parish that our petition to build a new Priest Residence has been approved by Bishop David O'Connell. We cannot thank enough our Buildings and Grounds Ministry as well as the Finance Council of the parish community for doing their herculean job on this upcoming project. Praise and thank the Good Lord for His goodness.

The Readings we have this Sunday ask us if we have experienced God's compassionate attention in our times of need. The meaning of the word compassion is to feel for another person. Feeling for another involves paying attention. Jesus is moved with compassion for a grieving widow. He raises her son to life, and gives him back to her. Elijah has compassion on his hostess, stretches himself out on her son, and asks God to return his life breath. God answers these prayers and Elijah gives him back to his mother. Attentive to the needs of two widows, Jesus and Elijah are filled with compassion and God returns life to the dead.

Compassionate and loving God, we thank you for visiting us through your prophets like Elijah, preachers and teachers like St. Paul, but most of all through your Son, Jesus Christ. Open up our eyes to the need of all, as you continue to share your life with us. Amen.

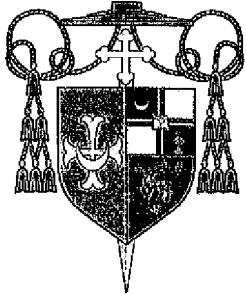

The location of the Priest Residence will be in the lot adjacent to the church. This has been a 3 1/2 year project during which time we have been preparing for this event. Our preparation has been to maintain our Church, Chapel and Rectory with minimal cost to the parish. All the maintenance over the past 3 1/2 years has been performed by our ministry without having to use outside contractors. These savings have helped us to bring about this project without requesting any funds from the parish. We have agreed to assist the builder to further reduce cost.
