

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.




Homebound Ministry

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Nineteenth Week of the Year.

One of the many reasons that Christians were persecuted in the 1st century was that pagans called them "cannibals." They had heard that these Christians ate flesh and drank blood. It is true, Jesus' words are shocking: Jesus describes himself as the "living bread," the bread from heaven is His flesh that He wants His followers to eat. While in our present world many want to be served and fed, Jesus does the opposite: He gives Himself as nourishment: Eat the bread of life. Eat my flesh. Eat me! After He was gone, they would still have God's word, and they would have His living bread for nourishment. They could smell, share, taste and swallow bread, an earthly reminder that Jesus would always be with them and was the bread that would take away all hunger.

Christ wants to be united with us in a unique way, in the most intimate way possible. As the saying goes, "You are what you eat." Jesus wants to be part of our lives, regardless of who we are. Bread was the staple food in his time and culture. Jesus speaks about Himself as the Bread of Life we should eat. He wants to become the staple food for our spiritual life. Staple food is not eaten once a year, or once a month or week. It is eaten daily! This makes us aware of the need to receive Christ in the Eucharist as often as possible.

As Catholics, we believe that when we receive the Eucharist we receive the body of Christ. Thomas Merton, a monk and a writer, suggested that "while we eat the substance of the true body of Christ under the sacramental species, we ourselves are eaten and absorbed by the mystical body of Christ, we become, as it were, perfectly part of that body, assimilated by it, one with its spiritual organism." By loving one another we are incorporated into the body of Christ and enlightened by Christ. We are to bring life to the world, as he did; courage, gifts and blessings come to us when we remain close to Jesus and deepen our relationship through the Eucharist.

It is so important for us to be mindful when we approach the Eucharist. The early Church Fathers taught: while ordinary food is assimilated into man, the very opposite takes place in communion. Here man is assimilated into the Bread of Life. This profound truth of Christ's total self-giving can help to overcome the tendency of just "going to Communion" when all others in the Church also line up. Be prepared and approach Jesus with reverence. Amen.

August 15—THE ASUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY.

I remember in my Mariology class when the Professor asked us to explain the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary, one of my classmates replied, "Yes, that's the teaching whereby the Catholic Church 'assumes' that Mary is in heaven."

There is of course a bit more to the dogma of the Assumption than that. The Church does not just "assume" that any canonized saint is in heaven. Rather, it declares with authority that a holy person is in glory and should therefore be honored in liturgy and imitated in life.

Mary shows us where we are going, what we are striving for. But we must remember that this was the end of a life completely devoted to love and service. Mary not only shows us the end goal, but she models for us how we should act to achieve that goal.

The Feast of the Assumption, therefore, prompts us to acknowledge the basis for our Christian joyful hope. We are pilgrims on a long journey. Our blessed mother has gone ahead. She tells us that we can make it, despite life's challenges and difficulties. If we are humble, faithful and obedient as she was, we will reach home. Her Assumption foreshadows our future, our resurrection. She tells us that our final home is not here on earth but in heaven. Amen.
