

Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners,

Today at all the Masses we are going to have the 'kick-off' for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Instead of the homily, the congregation is invited to watch the video from Bishop O'Connell. Please pay attention to the short message of His Excellency as he makes his presence to us and gives us information about the appeal. As we know, the Annual Catholic Appeal is integral to the mission and services of the Diocese of Trenton. It provides day-to-day assistance to those among us with the greatest needs, such as training for seminarians and for youth in our Catholic schools and religious education programs; the ACA ensures the funding necessary so that these programs may continue to serve thousands throughout our Diocese. The Diocese has assigned to our parish a goal of forty-four thousand dollars for 2018. As a parish we have to be mindful that as part of the ACA, funds are returned to our parish for our needs, such as maintenance to the Church/Chapel, parish office complex, fees for the maintenance of our grounds, snow removal etc. We encourage our parishioners to make our gifts early. What is the advantage? Not only does it give us the opportunity to spread payments of our gift over the remaining months of the year, making our contributions affordable and convenient, but also decreases the cost of mailings sent from the Development Office. Let us participate and support the ACA through our generous monetary contributions and pray for the success of this wonderful endeavor. Thank you so much for your generosity.

Due to the growing need of parishioners to come to the Parish Office on Sundays from 9 AM to 12:45 PM, which we found out is truly productive and effective, we are also changing the times and days of office hours. Beginning on March 1, 2018 our office is open from 9 AM to 2 PM from Monday to Thursday. The Parish office will be closed on Fridays. Please be guided accordingly.

This Saturday, February 24 at 10 AM, our First Communicants of the Religious Education Program are going to have their First Penance. We encourage our parents and elders to show them an example of your commitment to Jesus by also going to Confession and receiving your penance and absolution. The parish has invited other Priests in close-by parishes to help us. Keep in mind that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is God's wonderful sacrament of healing, mercy and love.

It was only a few weeks ago when we put away all of those Christmas decorations and other stuff for the Holidays. It is unthinkable that we now enter the season of Lent. Our Gospel reading today presents Jesus being led by the Spirit into the desert where he remained for many days. The desert is not a place where many people would like to go and stay. But, what good was it for Jesus to stay in the desert for forty days? As his disciples, why are we also being led by the Spirit into a kind of "desert"? First, it was in the desert that we are confronted with the truth of our poverty and nothingness, a privileged place that challenges us to live in humility and radical simplicity. The barren desert strips us of the things we attach ourselves to so obsessively and even violently. It is not easy to stay in the desert. Our inner struggles tempt us to go back to our life's securities and comfort.

Secondly, the desert helps us to acquire clarity and wisdom concerning the real value of things and profound meaning of life, where we can more clearly understand the true purpose of wealth, power, and God's gifts and talents, be grateful for what we have, and generously share it with others. Aware of our own poverty, we learn to respect, appreciate, and love all people no matter how different they are from us.

Thirdly, the desert invites us to hear the "beating of God's heart." In the desert's silence, we listen to God, are loved by Him, know His will and follow it with humility, courage and fidelity. It is when we have drawn our hearts so close to the Lord that we know it is the right time to begin and continue our mission.

FROM THE DIOCESE

LENTEN REGULATIONS


As we enter the Lenten Season, we offer a little refresher on what the Catholic Church in the United State requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and ABSTINENCE</u> (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. *St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Saturday this year.*
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18 to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.


Sharing the Gospel


