

#### SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up, you must fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

**Sacrament of Marriage**: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes or the welcome envelopes located in the narthex); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

#### SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS

We hear the truth in the old saying "You are what you eat." It is quite unfortunate; our national epidemic of obesity makes that all too clear. However, when we apply this to the spiritual food we eat and drink at the Eucharist, the saying takes on a new and more significant meaning. As disciples of Jesus who truly believe that the Risen Christ becomes really present, namely, body, blood, soul and divinity, under the outward signs of bread and wine, when we eat this spiritual food, we are being nourished on the risen life of Christ. Christ said the words of consecration over the bread aloud. However, before the words of the consecration, there was Christ's word of thanksgiving over the same bread, and Christ is thanking the Father for the gift of bread. Hence for this reason the sacrament is called Eucharist. In the Greek language, Eucharistia means thanksgiving.

We have to keep in mind that at the very moment Christ pronounced the word of consecration over the bread, that same moment the substance of the bread became the substance of Christ's flesh, it became the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi). The term theologian's use for this wondrous crossing over of substance is Transubstantiation.

The Angelic Doctor of Theology, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274), a Dominican, wrote profoundly about the Eucharist. In his poem, "Adoro Te" (I Adore You), he says that in the Eucharist man's senses are, as it were, deceived: the sense of sight is deceived because what we see is not flesh but bread, a wafer-like thing; the sense of touch as well, and the sense of taste and of smell, also deceived. We cannot in any way go by them. We only go by the sense of hearing: "This is my body...this is my blood..." Clinging to what we hear, we believe, we adore, and we love. And so when we are given the consecrated host at Holy Communion with the word, the Body of Christ, we affirm our faith by saying, "Amen!" Which means, we are affirming our faith not only in one sacrament, but in two. We also take the word of consecration by Christ as true. "Do this in memory of me."

If we really "are what we eat," then it is more than a metaphor when we speak of ourselves, the Church, as the living Body of Christ.

There is a common question against the Catholic Doctrine of the Eucharist, that we believe that Christ can be present in every tabernacle throughout the world. How can he be in so many places? We could reply that God is everywhere, but God is present to all things as the Creator. God is not in everywhere but God is present to everywhere, by causing it to be. In the Eucharist, Jesus is present in his humanity. Yet many Christians believe that when we pray to our Lord, they are heard by a human ear; that our prayers enter into his human heart; that his compassion is both human and divine. If we believe that, then we are already committed to a Christ who is extended in time and space, able to be present to all the human beings who call on him. How this can be is beyond our understanding while we live on earth. Yet how we are to make use of this wonderful mystery is so simple. It was St. John Vianney, a Pastor also known as the Cure d'Ars, who used to say over and over again, "He is there, he is there." That is all we need to know.

We are reminded that when we receive Communion, we also receive a mission. As we hear, one of the dismissal formulas in the celebration of the Mass: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." Then others should encounter Christ in and through us. Amen.

### IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING SOCIAL CONCERNS COMMISSION

You may recall completing a survey recently regarding several important social issues that the parish would like to begin addressing. This survey was part of the process to launch our newest ministry, the Social Concerns Commission. As you know, Social Concerns is intended to minster to our community's spiritual needs in the face of the most challenging of today's social issues. Some of these issues include homelessness, the opioid crisis, and suicide prevention.

As part of this new ministry's launch, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul will no longer have an affiliation with St. Catherine of Siena Parish. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul has served our local community for many years, and the service and aid that they have provided cannot possibly be measured.

Effective immediately, donations to the poor box will be directed to Social Concerns. In addition, there are three additional envelope collections for St. Vincent de Paul remaining this year. For these collections only (7/29/18, 9/30/18, and 12/30/18), monies collected that are made payable to SVdP, or enclosed in a SVdP collection envelope will be forwarded to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul . All other monies will be directed to Social Concerns. Please stay tuned for additional details as we finalize the transition of this important ministry.

**STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION** We are used to hearing the term "gifted" applied to people of exceptional ability or talent. Yet each of us is gifted. Through God's grace, each of us has strengths, gifts, talents, and abilities without which the Body of Christ, the Church, is incomplete. This key dimension of stewardship—the use of our gifts in service to others is the one many Catholics have trouble with. We can see ourselves, with prayer and sacrifice, giving more of our time and our treasure. But talent? That 's for those other people, the "gifted" ones, we think.

The term "talent' for a gift with which we have been entrusted by God comes from Jesus' Parable of the Talents, where it originally meant a valuable coin. Like the stewards in the parable, entrusted with valuable commodities by our Master, will we hide them away in fear, or invest in them for great return? Spend some time this week thinking about the gifts that you alone can share with our parish community and the wider world—and then make a plan to share them. "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1 Peter 4"10)

**STEWARDSHIP APPEAL UPDATE** Our Stewardship Appeal continues to meet with success. To date, 140 households have increased their weekly contribution in response to the letter from Father Angelito Anarcon, representing a combined weekly increase of \$1,569.00. The average increase in the weekly offering is \$11.21.






