

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

We are calling on our parishioners to see who would be interested in being a Cantor and a member of the Choir of the parish. As you can see in the Bulletin, we are still short of our goal of \$44,000 for the Annual Catholic Appeal. THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

A constant phrase that we hear nowadays is, "It's not a rocket science." Usually the one who speaks is trying to convince us that the message on offer should be relatively obvious and therefore easy to understand. Another appeal which people may make is that we need only use our common sense and the message will be clear.

When we listen to Jesus inviting us to reflect on our experience, he does something similar, often presenting us with paradoxes, statements that seem self-contradictory, but which in fact are inviting us to be honest with ourselves and recognize that it is all too easy to deceive ourselves, especially if the truth is likely to disturb what is commonly called our "comfort zones."

We sometimes hear people say, rightly or wrongly, that the poor are more generous than the rich. But are they really? What is your take on this? Our answer will probably depend on where we are coming from. If we believe that generosity is determined by how much we give, then the rich who usually can give more are therefore more generous than the poor. Do we agree?

In today's Gospel, Jesus invites his listeners to observe what is going on. The scribes were those learned men whose job was to interpret the Jewish Law, yet, like so many people vested with authority, they were tempted to go beyond their brief and introduce unnecessary new laws and customs. And these were designed to ensure that while they retained their social status and their comfort zones, others were forced to carry the additional burden. All Jesus needs to do is to invite his listeners to observe what is going on. They are opposite the treasury, where there were collection boxes to help defray the costs of running the Temple. The money was flowing in and it would seem that there were those who made sure that others were aware of how much they were contributing, but they were the rich and they could well afford it. By contrast Jesus draws their attention to the poor widow, who just put in two very small copper coins worth only a few cents.

If we go by the quantity or amount of their offerings, then the rich who gave much more than the poor widow can be said, indeed, to be more generous, but if we go by the quality or sincerity of one's offering, the poor widow gave more, much more. For, as our Lord himself noted, this poor widow, out of her poverty, put in everything that she had to live on.

Though the rich gave more to the temple treasury, whose money by the way, made the upkeep of the Temple possible, let us keep in mind that they gave out of their abundance, and therefore did not hurt their pockets that much.

In conclusion, generosity can either be quantitative or qualitative, two possible interpretations of one and the same act. But as to which is more pleasing to god, Jesus himself has answered it for us. It was the generosity of the widow that pleased him more because what she did was sacrificial as well as a selfless act. What the widow did was something that showed vividly her complete faith and trust in God's Divine Providence while not minding her own needs.

St. Pope John Paul II said, "Nobody is so poor that he has nothing to give and nobody is so rich that he has nothing to receive."

Real generosity carries with it always the sweet smell of sacrifice. Generous behavior is a light that shines through the darkness.

Amen.



SACRAMENTAL & FAITH FORMATION

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith.

OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF EIGIBILTY: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

Relics of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina to visit the Diocese of Trenton



Following the historic tour of the United States in 2017, relics of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina – better known as Padre Pio – will resume touring several Archdioceses and Dioceses in the United States of America from February 6th to May 11th (first part), and from September 6th to November 11th 2018 (second part). The relics will also be touring for the first time in Mexico and Canada. The relics will be at the Co-Cathedral of St. Robert Bellarmine of the Diocese of Trenton, on Tuesday, November 13, 2018, from 10 p.m. to 6:30 p.m..

The relics of Saint Pio available for public veneration will be the following (here on the picture): Saint Pio's glove; Saint Pio's crusts of the wounds; Cotton-gauze with Saint Pio's blood stains; A lock of Saint Pio's hair; Saint Pio's mantle; Saint Pio's handkerchief soaked with his sweat hours before he died. Mons. Thomas Gervasio, Vicar General of the Diocese of Trenton will celebrate a Mass in honor of Saint Pio at 7:00 p.m. The Saint Pio Foundation, which is sponsoring the tour on the occasion of the 50th commemoration anniversary of his passing, will sell books and items related to Padre Pio in the entryway of the Cathedral.
