

#### PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today at 11 o 'clock in the morning, our parish community is so happy to welcome the Traveling Guadalupe Torch coming from Our Lady of Perpetual help Parish in Maple Shade, New Jersey. Let us celebrate the Torch arrival with Las Ninas folk dancers and prayers. Our Knights of Columbus and Hospitality Ministry are happy to offer refreshments before and after the 11:30 Mass. The torch and image of Our Lady of Guadalupe will remain in the Church for the week and there will be activities to follow being handled and taken care of by different ministries of the parish. As a community of faith, everybody is expected to participate and be involved in the event. We cannot thank enough our dedicated volunteers and diligent ministry leaders as well as the whole parish for the support, the overwhelming participation and cooperation to make this event a success for the parish.

On December 12 of each year, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, marking the day, when, in 1531, the Blessed Mother appeared in Mexico to a 57-year old farm worker, Juan Diego. On that day and in that moment, the hills of Tepeyak are overcome by a silence, when our Lady tells him. "Listen and let it penetrate your heart... do not be troubled or weighed down with grief. Do not fear any illness or displeasure, anxiety or pain. Am I not here... who am your mother? Are you not under my shadow and protection? Am I not your fountain of life? Are you not in the folds of my mantle? ... In the crossing of my arms? Is there anything else you need?"

These are the words from Our Lady of Guadalupe to Juan Diego and these are the words that should resound from the walls of every Church and every home all over the world. This message and the miracle of the image that followed has entranced and encouraged Catholics for several centuries. Believers and non-believers the world over are inspired and intrigued by the apparition of Mary. Our Lady of Guadalupe is a story that invited us to know intimately the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God whose only desire is to bring us to her Son that we may have life and have it abundantly. Keep in mind that the traveling Guadalupe Torches are a symbol commemorating the apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe and her message.

#### SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

The Solemnity of Christ the King was instituted only in 1925 by Pope Pius X1. It was the time when kings were dethroned and established political powers were shaken. In this institution the Pope wanted to declare that while all the kings and emperors and rulers lose their power, it does not follow that we will move into a chaotic future. The truth is, Christ was, is and will always remain the King, not only of one nation or of one continent, but as the king of the universe.

Today's Gospel presents Jesus to us as affirming that he is a King, but that his kingdom does not "belong to this world." But if Jesus is not a political king, what kind of king is he? His royal throne is the Cross, the instrument of his execution. His kingdom is "not of this world." Then, what kind of kingdom is it? Pope Benedict said, "Jesus did not come to rule over peoples and territories, but to set people free from the slavery of sin and to reconcile them with God." Amen.

**ANNOINTING OF THE SICK:** To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

**BAPTISM**: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend.

**MATRIMONY**: Couples planning a marriage must contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

**RCIA**: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

**SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN**: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith.

**OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY**: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.
