

#### SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the 4th Sunday of the month. To sign up, please fill out the **registration form** on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Parishioners,

A story was told about a married lady who went out on a shopping spree, and when she returned home she brought with her a very beautiful dress. She showed it to her husband who almost had a heart attack when he heard how much it cost. She agreed with him that it was so expensive, but she said she tried it on and she looked so lovely in it and she couldn't resist the temptation to buy it. Her husband suggested that you should have said, "Get behind me, Satan." She said that's exactly what she said, and Satan said "you look magnificent from back here too!"

Today when we heard in the Gospel, Jesus told Peter, "Get behind me, Satan," he was not calling Peter a devil. He was saying that Peter was doing Satan's job by trying to tempt Jesus away from following what Jesus knew was the Father's will for him, to suffer and to die for the salvation of the whole world. As we know, the Jewish people knew an anointed leader was coming, one who would save God's people. That anointed leader was called Messiah, in the Hebrew language, and Christ, in the Greek language. They expected, however, a powerful and glorious savior, not a suffering Messiah.

Peter answered correctly that Jesus was the Messiah, the Christ, but he did not know about the suffering the Messiah would have to undergo. He is rightly recognized as a wonderful saint. So many people see themselves reflected in his flawed humanity and find hope in the fact that, despite all his struggles, he ultimately became a saint. But what makes Peter a great saint is not his weaknesses and flaws, but his deep faith in Christ. It is the fact that he finally came to embrace the truth of Jesus' words, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me."

This truth is very evident when we recall that it was Peter who denied and deserted Jesus in his time of need. There, the one who declares Jesus to be the Messiah, proved himself to be a fair-weather friend. So huge is Peter's misunderstanding of Jesus and his mission that he even felt able to rebuke him. But in one of the most shocking Gospel interactions, Jesus turns on Peter in the strongest way, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Those are strong words indeed. Peter had to learn that Jesus was the master and Teacher. Peter has forgotten that he was Jesus' follower when he called Jesus aside and started to instruct Jesus that he would not have to go through any suffering. Peter was totally out of step with Christ.

Upon hearing this Gospel, it is good for us to reflect and ask what we believe about Jesus. If we simply see him as a prophet, can we truly believe in the reconciliation offered through his cross and Resurrection? Or are we just like Peter, happy to admit and confess that he is the Christ but unable to embrace the fullness of what that means?

To follow Peter's example, it is a great idea to see his whole story, namely, his post-denial regret and tears, his declarations of love at the Sea of Galilee. Also, his post-Pentecost fortitude and courage to preach the Risen Jesus. These are what make Peter great and worthy of our high regard of him. We can learn so much from Peter. It is not impossible that we might be attracted to his flawed humanity; we should not ignore the work that God has done in strengthening and empowering him to be a disciple and evangelist.

As we imitate Peter, we too need to let Christ change us if we are to let go of human ways of thinking. Yes, it is difficult but necessary. We should keep in mind that Baptism is never just a moment in time or a cultural expectation, but the beginning of a true relationship with Christ. And it is a relationship that lasts all of our lives and calls us to be always open to Christ and his word. Amen.




