

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the 4th Sunday of the month. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

It is good to be mindful of the fact that we are back to our usual schedule wherever we may be, in school, at our work, in the Church. It is quite important to note that just as we continue to eat, breath, sleep and all the basic things that we need or do, God would never in any way stop taking good care of us, as he continues to love us.

Today we celebrate the 23rd Sunday of the year. As we reflect and pray on the readings, the basic belief of our faith reminds us that Jesus saves; the very name Jesus means "God saves." If we do not know Jesus as a savior, we do not know Jesus at all. But what does he save us from? He saves us from many things. Personally, I can't say how many times I've felt Jesus' saving presence in avoiding a terrible vehicular accident while driving on the road. He saves us from sin and the effects of sin, perhaps from strong temptation, major sickness, or harm from someone who does not like us. We believe that at the end of our lives, he brings those who love him into his kingdom of eternal life and assures us that we will share in his risen life on the finality of days. We just mentioned some of the ways and experiences we truly acknowledge him as our savior. Full of hope, we can see that he is with us as our savior all through our lives and beyond into eternity. "I came that they may have life and may have it to the full." (Jn.10:10)

In today's Gospel, we are shown how Jesus may touch us with his healing love if we ask him. Interestingly, we are told that first, the family and friends of the deaf man begged Jesus to cure the man. What Jesus has done reminds all of us about prayer. There were a good number of people asking for a favor from the Lord, they were so persistent and never gave up. They approached Jesus with a sense of urgency and high expectations knowing that our Lord will respond to their plea.

Jesus' outward actions today are symbolic, the miracle is not. Jesus placing his finger in the man's ears symbolically represents opening his ears to sound. Spitting on the tongue symbolically represents loosening, the man's tongue. The miracle resides in the power of God, in the person of Jesus Christ, who releases the man from his infirmities, saying: "Ephphatha! Be opened!"

Jesus recognizes the unthinkable position of the man who is deaf and has a speech impediment, how he is viewed by the general population and suffers rejection by being held at a distance all the time. Jesus refuses to allow the situation to continue so he beckons the man and calls him to him.

Be opened. Right to the heart of the matter. How is Jesus challenging us to be opened? To open our ears to the Gospel message rather than refusing to hear it, or ignore it, to open our lips to proclaiming the Gospel message rather than remaining silent.

We might be inclined to say the man in today's Gospel had an excuse, but do we? There is no excuse for us when it comes to hearing Jesus speak to us and sharing what he has to say with others. Coming here to church makes very little sense if we are coming with no intention of listening or repeating what we hear God say to us.

Is it possible we are being called today to hear our Lord and strengthen our voices when it comes to living our faith among others? Jesus is a wise teacher, teaching us by every way possible. In today's Gospel, Jesus is teaching us that there is no single way in which we must do things as Christians. Often, we may feel that to be a faithful follower of Jesus we need to speak and act publicly; and some of us may find that is not the easiest thing to do. The Gospel of today points to the fact that this is not always the most effective way. There are many occasions in our lives when we can be powerful witnesses to Jesus by what we do in private, without anyone else knowing what is done. These are the often-unseen ways in which we show love and care for those in need, such as the visit to a person who is sick, the welcome we offer to someone who is lost or lonely, the generosity to the homeless person whom everyone else ignores, the constant love with which we support our children. All the above mentioned may bear quiet yet faithful witness to Christ. Amen.


