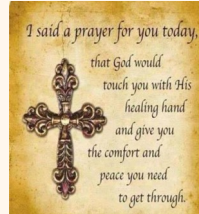

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the FIFTH SUNDAY of LENT

I would like to start this reflection with a true story that has been told. The teacher gave her class a mathematics test. The first instruction on the test was: "Read through all the questions on this paper before you begin to write your answers." There then followed a list of thirty mathematical problems to solve.

As expected, most students jumped straight into the questions, working their way through to the end. It was then they discovered that the final question turned out not to be a question at all but another instruction. It said: "Now that you have read through this test paper, please ignore all the questions above and simply stand up and quietly leave the classroom." The observant students, who followed the first instruction to read through all the questions before they started answering, passed the test by merely getting up and walking out of the room after a couple of minutes. It was a great lesson to teach the students not to rush to give an answer or make a judgment.

There's a great deal of making rash judgments and demanding quick answers in our Gospel today. Only Jesus seems to take the time carefully to read the bigger picture of the whole situation. He resists the temptation to offer a swift response like simple "yes" or "no" answer to the question the scribes and Pharisees put to him. Instead, Jesus gathers his thoughts. He bends down and starts doodling in the dust, thinking, pondering, reflecting, seeing the broader picture.

Here is an interesting question, have you ever been "caught in the act?" There is no way to get out of it, though we often try. The woman was caught in the act. So was the man. Where was he? He deserved the same punishment. Jesus catches the leaders in the act of misunderstanding the law in a way that imprisons them.

Jesus offers a new way. Taking his time he writes on the ground. We don't know what he wrote. Whatever it was, they are moved to change their intentions, and Jesus invites anyone without sin to cast the first stone. They walk away and no longer condemn her; neither does Jesus. He forgives her and tells her to sin no more.

As we can see, Jesus did something new. He put her situation in a context we all share, and that is, we all sin and need God's absolution. If we turn to Jesus, admit our need for forgiveness, and take on the suffering that changing our hearts and our ways can entail, we will experience the promised resurrection that Paul proclaims in today's second reading.

However, we have a choice. We can be honest when caught in the act and suffer the consequences of sin or judgment, thus opening the way to forgiveness and acceptance. Also, we can try to wiggle our way out and miss God's freely offered mercy. Admitting our sin and need for God turns weeping into rejoicing at the great things God does for us.

Our God, full of mercy, all of us are and sinners need your merciful love. Make us turn to you today to hear you say to us, "Neither do I condemn you." Amen.

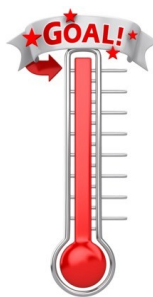

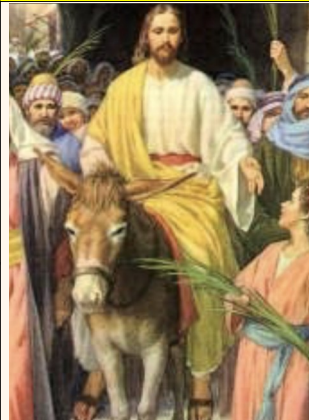

SACRAMENT & FAITH FORMATION

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the **1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May**. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, according to Canon Law, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (*showing attendance through the use of your Church Envelopes, the Welcome Envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare Online Giving*); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added to our prayer list.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA: We welcome all on Monday's after the 9 am Mass in our Chapel.
