

OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today marks the beginning of a new calendar year for the Church, Year A: Sunday Cycle. It's the first Sunday of Advent. Advent season, as we know, calls all of us to prepare and be ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus. Hence, we have reconciliation and penance services combined for the parishioners and our very own religious education students. The first service starts at 4:30 P.M. tomorrow and the next one is at 6:15 P.M. in the Church. To accommodate the other religious education classes we will to give another window of opportunity to our parishioners who want to come to the sacrament. We are glad to have my brother priests helping us as they hear confessions and give absolutions to our penitents. We are grateful and appreciate their generosity of time to the parish community.

We observe Sundays in Advent with some important liturgical activities like the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying together as a Christian Community the Evening Prayers, Adoration, and Benediction, which starts at 7 P.M. in the Church. Please come and join us.

There is a story told by Daniel Webster, a famous lawyer, and statesman in the 19th century. It is all about the reason why he worked so hard. He narrated an incident that happened when he was a child at home on a poor farm. His father left him and his brother Ezekiel for the day with instructions on the work they had to do. When his father returned and saw the job undone, he questioned his sons about their laziness. "What have you been doing, Ezekiel?" "Nothing, sir," replied Ezekiel. "Well, Daniel, what have you been doing?" "I've been helping Ezekiel, sir." We are often told that we must be alert and be ready. But ready for what? At this time of the year, people are getting ready for Christmas, for winter, and for dark days. Some people are preparing for death, while some are preparing for a new life in their families. Life goes on amid all this coming and going.

In the days of Noah, everyone is busy with the normal routines, such as eating and drinking, making new relationships and holding on to old ones. In the midst of all this normal business, we find an old eccentric man who is busy with his family building a boat in spite of the fact that there is nowhere in sight to sail it. In the end, Noah is the one who is ready because he is alert to the instructions that God, the Father gave to him.

We all know today that the catastrophe we face is not a flood but a lot of things like nuclear war, terrorism, etc. It could be argued that the only people who are prepared for that are the military who maintain a total watch around the clock. The entire Western defense system follows the advice to be vigilant, stay awake, and to be ready. Noah built an ark to ride out the disaster of the flood. But no one can ride out a nuclear catastrophe, for there is no place to flee. There is no shelter deep enough. There is no sanctuary from dangerous storms. But, there is another way to prepare for peace.

God has not advised to us build a boat, buy a parachute, or construct an air raid shelter. Instead we are being called to listen to the Lord. As Isaiah says, "he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." Probably none of us will be here to see that blessed day that Isaiah describes. "Nation will not lift sword against nation. There will be more training for war." From the Gospel, we see Jesus himself seemed to think that war would be a permanent feature on the human landscape, and we know that history has not contradicted him.

That is the reason why we have to pay attention to the word of the Lord. As St. Paul says in today's second reading, "You know the time has come: you must wake up now." When people are engaged full-time, satisfying their own craving, they are not disposed to face reality and take responsibility for their own actions.

Here is how you can make life enjoyable. All you have to do is pay attention. When we get bored with life, it is because we don't take the time to understand it's meaning. Every moment of our life, we are making decisions about how to live. The most important of all is the decision to look for God's purpose in every moment of our lives, or the decision to ignore God. When we get bored, we start looking for some dramatic change in our lives. We want to get away from where we are. We can be so concerned with being somewhere else that we end up not being anywhere.

Meanwhile, life goes on. We are warned against looking for signs of the Lord's return. Then again, it would be foolish to think that anything on this earth lasts forever. So Jesus is telling us to concentrate on the ordinary things of life and to be at peace with our neighbor. He will come again, but he will come in his own time. Amen.



ANOIDING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.**

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** Please stop by the Parish Office to request a sponsor certificate. All certificates are approved by the Pastor.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA: We welcome all on Mondays after the 9 am Mass in our Chapel.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.
