

The Epiphany of the Lord January 6, 2019

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!
Your light has come,
the glory of the Lord shins upon you.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord Jesus.

It is no exaggeration to say that the story included in the Gospels is there for the purpose of enlightening us and helping us enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ. Each of the four Gospels was written for Christian communities coping with the social circumstances in which they found themselves. Matthew was writing for his own Jewish people and one of his concerns was that they grasped the fact that Jesus, while he had come to liberate them, had also come to liberate all men and women for all time.

Today's Gospel selection is laden with concrete details. First, this child is born of Mary, in the days of Herod, born in Bethlehem and named Jesus in the line of David. These details are not intended as an eyewitness account of the birth of Jesus, but rather they interpret the faith and serve to tell us something of God and God's own deepest concerns.

With the birth of this child, God comes into our history. God breaks into the particularity of the Jewish people and manifest's himself for all of us. In this act, there stands open to us the reality of God, whose power is grasped not so much in terms of force, but in terms of love. The mystery long hidden is now revealed. The birth of this man, Jesus, indeed his entire life should make it possible for us to see that God's own deepest concern is our salvation. In his birth, God identifies with our cause and our concerns. In the humanity of Jesus, God is present in the struggle to overcome the movement of evil, both individual and social, that is the substance of human life and human history.

In today's world, the invitation to all of us is to be ever conscious of the need to reach out to everyone and embrace all people as God's precious children. With so many displaced people traveling across countries to avoid persecution, warfare and violence, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, has appealed to us to see in them the face of Christ and make them welcome. The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord provides a wonderful opportunity for us to think again about the expansive and all-embracing nature of God's revelation to the world, embodied in Jesus, and above all, what it means for us to respond to the needs of our brothers and sisters. Amen.



If you do not receive your new envelopes by the end of December, please contact the Parish Office. Your first envelope is dated January 1, 2019.

SACRAMENT & FAITH FORMATION

SOCIAL CONCERNS

ANNOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the 4th Sunday of the month. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.


