

OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

To all our mothers, we recognize your extraordinary dedication for being an effective instrument in bringing productive life to the whole world. You have volunteered for a 24-hour, seven days a week job with no pay. Although at times your love is tested, mothers don't give up. With few material rewards, you make tremendous sacrifices for the joy of being able to help our God create one or more beautiful human beings whom you care for and who might someday care for you. With so many responsibilities, it is no wonder a mother has to get down on her knees at times and call on God for help. Prayer is one of the things that bring us together right now. Our congratulations to mothers, grandmothers, and those of you who have the role of being a mother to people who they are not related to by blood, but are related to by love. God bless you, mothers!

Today our First Communion Students are going to offer flowers to the Blessed Mother at all our Masses. It is a beautiful gesture to show our gratitude and thanks to the Mother of our Lord and our own special mothers. We appreciate the participation and assistance of our dedicated volunteer catechists, aides and the fantastic support of our beloved parents of our students in their formation.

Today is the FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

I once visited a parish where I have served as a parochial vicar for more than seven years. After a service, while having a lively conversation with a parishioner, I broke into laughter. The parish business manager came from her office and said, "I heard your laugh and knew you were back!" When we have been close to others, we recognize their voices, laughs, and presence, striving to reconnect with one another. Such was the intimacy Jesus seeks with all who believe in Him.

The Jewish leaders in Antioch were not as inclusive in how they understood God's love; unlike Paul and Barnabas were. They could not or would not accept that Christ was a light to the Gentiles and offered salvation to all. Because they narrowly defined who belonged and who did not, they could not or would not accept people who heard and followed Jesus' voice outside their narrow definition. They had Paul and Barnabas expelled because the leaders were not ready to believe that God could call anyone other than their kind.

The aforementioned has been true throughout history. A narrow definition of who can hear the voice of God, Christ, or the Spirit, has resulted in the persecution of people who believe differently than we do. We start crusades and holocausts, build walls, and even kill those who refuse to convert to a particular faith. The Body of Christ has been divided by narrow definitions of 'truth.' God's love is much more inclusive as we heard it from John; his vision pictures a great multitude from every nation, race, people, and tongue before God's throne.

God, our shepherd, open our ears to recognize your voice and follow your Son, Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Open our eyes to see you where we least expect. Amen.

SACRAMENTAL AND FAITH FORMATION

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA: We welcome all on Monday's after the 9 am Mass in our Chapel.

LOW GLUEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.


