


FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we announced at all Masses last weekend, Parish Office is now open to the public, in person, with restrictions and following the Diocese's directives, such as wearing a face covering, temperature check, and filling out a form provided by the Office. Keep in mind that we are doing this not just to follow the guidelines but also to be safe, away from sickness and harm, and to reduce the spread of the Virus. It is not easy to implement all of these directives, but we want to cover our bases. We want to save lives and protect each other. If you need something essential from the Parish Office, kindly make a phone call or email us, we are glad to serve you. We thank you for your kind understanding, and hopefully, this pandemic will come to an end soon.

Since we have the proper types of equipment for the cleaning and disinfecting the Church and the Parish Hall, we gladly announce the addition of the 11:30 A.M. Mass on Sunday in the Church. The weekend Mass schedule is as follows: 4:30 P.M. Saturday Vigil Mass; Sunday, 10:00 A.M. Mass in the Church and also using the Parish Hall for an overflow of attendance, plus 11:30 A.M. Mass in the Church. It is good to see our loyal and devoted people of the community are coming back to Church for the Sunday Liturgies, even if they know that the dispensation given by the Bishop of not fulfilling Sunday obligation is still in effect until September 7, 2020. By any chance, whenever I see some of our Churchgoers in the store or any business establishment, they usually have the common question, "Father, when are going to re-open?" Now, you have the answer. For it is quite apparent we miss not only the worship building, but most importantly, we miss each other as we worship and offer our praise and thanksgiving to the Lord God.

Indeed, we are blessed to have the opportunity to re-open and continue our faith, given this unprecedented time. We cannot deny the fact that we have challenges and tests as we prepare and work on the re-opening, but through the concerted efforts and performance of our team, we are fortunate enough to make it happen.

Please continue to support us with your monetary gifts through your offertory collections, either by envelopes submitted to the collection boxes we have provided in the Church or through online giving. We cannot thank you enough for your generosity and outpouring support. We, as a family of God in our parish community, count and depend on your goodness and benevolence. My heart is moved because of your positive attitude and continues to inspire me with your loving-kindness.

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The parable of the Sower in the Gospel today is quite easy to predict. If we throw seed on the ground, some will grow if the climate agrees and if there are enough sun and moisture. In reading Matthew's Gospel from the beginning until the end, we would see that today's Gospel describes the various ways people had been responding to Jesus up to this point in his public ministry, accused of being possessed, of one who breaks the divine law, and a blasphemer. Some people thought that he was a great healer and made them well; they went away happy, pursued their business and did not seek to know any more about him. Some enjoyed his stories, staying entertained as long as he was willing to treat them. Others thought he had something worthwhile to say, and they continued to listen to him and learn from him. Jesus was like the farmer sowing the seed. Although he could not touch all their hearts, those whose hearts he did touch grew and produced good fruit; that is, their lives were virtuous and pleasing to God.

In today's parable, Jesus' strong message is to know first that the kingdom of heaven is not an entitlement. Just because the seed of grace has been planted in our hearts, it will die if we do nothing with it. If it lives in us, it will grow. We know that some of the growth we experience in life happens automatically, such as growing physically. However, other kinds of growth require intentional effort, such as increasing in enough knowledge to get a degree or growing in particular skills; that is, athletic or artistic; or knowing how to get along socially with others or manage our finances so we can support ourselves.

Growing in God's grace and holiness is similar to this second kind of growth. It is intentional on our part. It is not accidental. It involves making a choice that Jesus is more important to us than anything or anyone else. It means choosing to believe that he has come to teach us the way to God and faithfully follow him. It also involves patience as we wait for the fullness of the kingdom. Just as God has given us the sun and the rain to make the seed grow, hence if we put forth the effort spiritually, then God will supply the means to produce an extraordinarily harvest in our lives. Amen.





The prophet Isaiah assured the captive Israelites exiled in Babylon that God's word is reliable and purposeful. Does this bring you comfort or distress?




Paul speaks of a spiritual connection and yearning for freedom (redemption) shared between us and creation itself. What do you think a redeemed creation looks like?


