


FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Though the whole world is still in the middle of the COVID 19 pandemic, it is interesting to see the faithful of our parish community manifest their strong desire to be back to the Church. With their eagerness to be with the Lord as they pray and worship together, thanking the Creator as they come for the Sunday and weekday liturgies. It is so inspiring to witness their willingness to follow and observe the given directives from the government and the Bishop to be able to come to Mass. Yes, we can say that there are too many rules; however, they were handed down to us for a reason, that



is, for us to be safe, healthy, and be away from the harm caused by COVID 19. We credit our parishioners who were cooperative and patient, knowing that we have limits and restrictions to the worship place. Since the Church had already reached the limit for occupancy, they had to go to the Parish Hall so they could attend the 10:00 a.m. Mass last Sunday. Thanks to Msgr. Liddy for presiding the Mass and Deacon Dan for his assistance. We also thank our dedicated parish personnel for helping out and directing our faithful. We appreciate all the time and effort they have given to us.

Once again, we would like to recognize the generosity and care of our parishioners. You are always so supportive of giving monetary donations and offertory gifts for the necessary items to maintain the cleanliness and safety of our Parish Complex, the Church Building, and the Parish Hall. Knowing that we also have to pay the bills for the maintenance of the parish as well as our parish staff, we credit and thank them profusely. For those who have not responded to our appeal, prayerfully consider your donation according to your means and capability. May God continue to bless you with good health and safety, for no one can outdo God's generous love.

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We are amid a pandemic, a worldwide virus crisis, that separates and divides us. Because we want not only to follow the CDC guidelines to be safe and not to get sick, we must practice social distancing from each other, especially from people we don't know. As a precaution, we must wear a face mask, etc. All of these, we hope, is just temporary. However, as the letter to the Hebrews tells us: "Remember always to welcome strangers, for by doing this, some people have entertained angels without knowing it." From Abraham and Sarah onwards, the Scriptures show how people who extend hospitality to strangers are often the ones who end up receiving God's hospitality.

In today's first reading, the prophet Elisha wants to give some recompense to the unnamed woman who is so generous in her welcome to the holy man and his companion. She declines his offer, saying that she has everything she needs. Her generosity has not only given hope of reward but is an expression of her kindness, of the sort of person that she is. However, the prophet can promise her the one thing she desires: the gift of a son.

In the Gospel, Jesus intensifies this teaching on the importance of welcome and hospitality. Christ identifies so closely with his disciples that he states that anything done to help them will be regarded as done to him personally, even something as trivial as offering a cup of water. And by welcoming him, we welcome the Father who sent him. God is never outdone in hospitality. Always, when we welcome God into our lives, in our prayers, in our service to others, in faithfulness to our calling, we find ourselves blessed, enriched by that encounter.

In many and countless small ways, it is God's very self who is the invisible guest in our daily lives. For when we welcome strangers, feed hungry people, clothe those who are naked, visit those who are sick or imprisoned, then it is Christ himself whom we are welcoming. And as a result, we are changed by that encounter, by being more compassionate, more willing to serve, more ready to turn away from sin, more gentle, more open to life, more able to love. In other words, we become more like the God we welcome. Amen.




Inspiration for the week


