FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It is hard to believe that we are already in the middle month of August. The summer season is a great time for fun. We have the kids out from school, welcomed vacation days, relaxing time at the shore, and gatherings with families and friends. Summer is an excellent time for these and other exciting activities. Folks, let us maximize the time we still have for living our life to the fullest as we are mindful that opportunities, time, and relationships are blessings and gifts from God. We should not waste nor squander these great chances that God has given us. Let us unceasingly be grateful for the many blessings that we continue to have.

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Today we celebrate the fact that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven. Christians worldwide have a long tradition of celebrating the Dormition (falling asleep) of Mary. It was Pope Pius X11 who defined the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary on November 1, 1950. In his encyclical Munificentissimus Deus (Generous God), he also cited Mary's intimate connection with her Son--- the new Adam --- and His victory over sin and death.

To understand the end of Mary's life, one will have to appreciate the beginning of it entirely. From the moment of her conception by St. Anne and St. Joachim, Mary was free from sin. The Holy Spirit was preparing her by his grace so that she would be capable of welcoming the Son of God. Yes, later, when the Angel Gabriel approached this young woman from Nazareth, her obedient "fiat" (yes) was made possible by her deep faith.

Truly convinced that nothing will be impossible for God, Mary sets off to visit her cousin, Elizabeth. In today's Gospel, Elizabeth names Mary as blessed among women and identifies her as the mother of my Lord. Indeed, the baby in her womb who leaped for joy was destined to become the greatest prophet to recognize the Messiah - John the Baptist.

The focus of Mary's assumption into heaven is not on her as one unique member of the human race. It is on the full fruition of the graces of Christ's resurrection offered to the whole human race embodied in her. Mary stands for all of us.

In the Gospels, Jesus does not single his mother out for honor because of her biological role but responds to her as someone who hears God's word and gives it flesh and bones. Like all of his disciples, Mary walks by faith and not by sight. She treasures what words she has received of Jesus, pondering them in her heart. Her prayer gives her insight into what is ungodly in the world and the faith and confidence that she can do something about it, despite her low status.

Mary's questions in the Gospel narratives are our questions: How is it that God can work through such weak instruments as we feel ourselves to be? Why does God sometimes seem to hide from us when we search with such anxiety? How can the tasteless water of our lives be turned into life-giving wine of God's grace? Her song can be our song, rejoicing in a God who enters fully into all that is fragile and earthly human experience, into the blood and guts of our human bodies, but also into their beauty and their capacity to give and receive love.

Like Mary, our life of faith must be sustained in prayer, both personal and communal prayer. Our participation in the liturgy both expresses and nourishes our faith. Making time in our day for personal prayer, too, enables us to appreciate God's abiding presence and places us in deeper communion with him. If we follow Mary's example, a routine prayer, a habit of praise, and a total submission to God's will, we will join in her heavenly reward. Amen.







Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.



Did you know that this August marks the 140th anniversary of the Diocese of Trenton?

In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the



southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools and

51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen.
