

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we are enjoying the last few weeks of this summer season, a friendly reminder to the parents of our young people to be mindful that the Office of Religious Education is open and currently enrollment for accepting the upcoming catechetical school year. Our parish needs volunteer catechists and aides to help in the program. Remember that the first catechist for our ones are the parents, especially the mother. Thus, we are calling the mothers to share their time, effort, and experience and be involved in the parish's Religious Education Program. As we know, the parish and other institutions are only supplementary to the needs of the children, most notably when it comes to their faith and sense of God. Everything starts at home.

Time and again, we have reminded everyone that the pandemic is still with us, and variants are continue to emerge. We should be more careful and adhere to the protocols of the authorities, like wearing masks and face coverings when we are indoors, regardless of our vaccination status. It is strongly recommended, but not mandatory, for us to wear masks for health and safety reasons, and we have to think not only for ourselves but for the common.

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Joshua, the man who succeeded Moses as leader of Israel, is celebrated as the bravest field commander in Jewish history. When Joshua became old, and the country is resting from war, he calls the tribes of Israel to the ancient sanctuary at Shechem. The story is told in the first reading. All the elders, leaders, judges, and scribes are called to listen in the last farewell of their distinguished leader. He does not recall his military victories, nor does he ask the people to cherish what he has done for them. Instead, he asks them to choose whom they wish to serve: the God of their ancestors or the false gods of the land they now inhabit.

It's as if Joshua wants to be remembered not as a great military commander who brought his people to the Promised Land but as the prophet who brought his people to choose God again.

This inner battle of faith seems to preoccupy him more than his military campaigns ever did. He gives the people to the God of Israel.

Joshua is tired; he is old; death is looking him in the face. He has seen too much bloodshed to boast of the beauty of battle; he has seen too many ruined cities and disfigured corpses to sing of the glories of war. The old commander is concerned with the geography of the heart. Joshua knows that all choices have to be renewed, that people don't stay dedicated to a cause just by continuing to exist. Joshua asks his people to choose, and he declares his own choice to serve the Lord before them. Thus, Joshua wins the last and most crucial battle of his life when he leads his people to a victory of fidelity. They declare: "We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

The choice that Joshua offered his people is echoed in today's Gospel when Jesus offers his followers the option to stay with him or join the ranks of unbelievers. After hearing Jesus' teaching on the bread of life, many followers express their intolerance. Many of them do choose to leave him. Then. Like Joshua to the twelve tribes, Jesus turns to the twelve apostles and gives them a choice to close the book on their shared past. But just as the twelve tribes told Joshua that they could not reject the Lord after all he had done for them, Peter asks Jesus how they could turn to anyone else for the message of eternal life, so the apostles exercise their freedom of choice by choosing to stay with Jesus.

Both Joshua and Jesus respect people's freedom of choice. They know that past choices can become old and exhausted, that they can die from being abandoned on the scrap heap of life. Past choices have to be kept alive by a new commitment because decisions in faith are never settled once and for all. The apostles do what we must all do: choosing Jesus, staying with the one who has the message of eternal life. Amen.

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.



Did you know that this August marks the 140th anniversary of the Diocese of Trenton?

In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the



southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools

51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen.


