

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Hearing about all the current global events can be overwhelming as we see the ongoing issues and tragedies happening worldwide. There's Afghanistan, natural calamities that damage and kill lives like the earthquake in Haiti. Many things are happening locally, like the most recent storm that has brought instant flooding and damaging winds. All of this on top of a pandemic. Some people were asking me what and why are these things happening? I don't have the answers, and perhaps no one can give the correct answer. However, let us be more positive, hopeful and avoid being cynical and pessimistic. Let us keep up the faith as we continue to pray earnestly, manifest our compassion, and do what we can to alleviate this world's challenges.

Please allow me to reiterate what I mentioned on last Sunday Masses about our financial support to the parish. Most of our parishioners are blessed with consistent and dependable paychecks. Yet, have you ever thought about how you would manage your bills if you were never sure how much money you would have in your bank account. We recognize that this is a constant problem our parish community faces every month as we continue to experience and deal with the current health crisis due to the Covid 19 pandemic. Weekly giving can fluctuate from average, high, and low.

While we are most grateful for any gift that any parishioner can give to help us maintain a more consistent cash flow, we have an online giving program. Those parishioners who are using the program tell us it is a great help to them too. It allows them to budget the amount they want to give back to God and helps them feel assured that their parish is receiving their gift even when they are out-of-town, too busy to remember an envelope, or attending Mass at another parish. TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is accused of flouting sacred tradition. Religious officials from Jerusalem and local Pharisees want to know why Jesus permits his disciples to disregard the unwritten tradition of the elders. The problem is that the disciples do not wash their hands before they eat. The complaint is not that the disciples ignore good hygiene but that they ignore the tradition of ceremonial washing. In doing so, they are numbered among the unclean.

According to the written Law, ceremonial washing was required only of priests before they entered the sanctuary. However, by the time Jesus, the ritual of hand-washing, before every meal and between each course, has been extended to include all pious Jews. In the unwritten tradition of legal interpretation, the Pharisees regarded the oral Law as binding as the written Law. And they expect Jesus to share their religious outlook.

Jesus accuses his accusers of being hypocrites, quoting the prophet Isaiah to underline the point: *"These people honor me only with lip service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless; the doctrines they teach are only human regulations."*

In clinging to human tradition, they ignore the commandments of God. Jesus wants to free people from the weight of an oppressive practice that concentrates on approved performance. When religious performance is lacking in heart, it makes for worthless worship.

Jesus teaches the crowd spiritual revolutionary doctrine, which puts him at odds with his religious tradition: nothing that a man wants can defile him, only what comes from his own heart. In this, Jesus declares all foods clean and shifts moral attention to how people choose and what they do. For Jesus eating with unwashed hands is imaginary defilement. So is eating unapproved food. Uncleanliness is a matter of what proceeds from the human heart. It's not people's diet that interests Jesus; It's their heart condition.

Jesus is interested in the stirrings of the human heart, the personal issues that preoccupy us and influence our choices and behavior. The territory within, with all its complex emotions and desires, holds Jesus's attention. He knows that no external law can change people's hearts, even if it makes them socially conform. That is why when he began his preaching, he invited everyone: "Set your hearts first on the kingdom of God." Jesus believes that when people's hearts are centered on God, they are emancipated from the litany of human regulations that would script their every move.

For some of his hearers, what Jesus said was bad news because it contradicted the tradition they honored. For us, we call it Good News, Gospel, because it is a word that liberated us from the world of endless regulations. It also challenges, motivates, and invites us to live a religion of the heart. To have a heart for Jesus and his values should always be our real business as Christians. Amen.







Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM
