FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As a parish community of St. Catherine, we participated in a Missionary Appeal last weekend. We listened attentively to their sharing and talks in all of the Masses with warm welcome and hospitality. The HANDS TOGETHER Missionaries presented the purpose of their appeal, and we recognize the great need to support the people of Haiti as they are considered the "poorest of the poor." Our hearts go to the missionaries as they work so hard to help them. As a manifestation of our strong support, our parish was able to collect more than \$1,500.00. We cannot thank enough all of those who contributed. For sure, God will reward them with more graces and blessings. Thanks very much.

Hunger is an experience that we face in different ways. On a basic level, we know what it is like to be hungry for food. During these challenging times, when we hear that there will be some restrictions on our daily life, there can be a ripple effect on our essential needs, most especially limitations of food supplies and basic goods necessary for our existence. It is only natural that we would have anxieties, and some of us would panic by hoarding the reserve and taking advantage.

But a common experience we share as humans is our non-physical hunger. Our hunger for love. Our hunger for community and belonging. Our hunger for fulfilling experiences. Our hunger for God. Interestingly, people in general and, most notably our parishioners, are a concrete example of a yearning and longing for God. They cannot wait to come to Church and be with each other and share their stories, and most importantly, their faith experience, worshipping and thanking God together for all the blessings and graces they have received despite the public health crisis and the challenges they are experiencing. We can easily understand that some of us are still discerning and trying to feel if it is now safe and appropriate to come out. Unfortunately, some of us have medical conditions that prevent them from getting the vaccine and are not too sure of the side effects on their physical and mental well-being. Overall, we are blessed and fortunate to be in Church now and manifest our faith together even if we still have to be very careful and mindful that we are not out of the woods yet. The Governor recently announced it, and the Bishop strongly recommends that we wear our face masks indoors, especially in the celebration of the Mass, even if we are fully vaccinated. We have to think not only of our safety but also of others. In God's time, this pandemic will be over. Let us continue to beg the Lord and ask for His love and mercy to keep us safe and protected at all times.

NINETEENTH SUNDAY OF THE ORDINARY TIME

Malnutrition is one of the leading killers of our time. Grim, frightening statistics prove it. But there is another form of malnutrition, more pervasive and even more destructive than the physical one, that is, the malnutrition of the spirit. Various factors are responsible for this. Denial of freedom of expression and lack of freedom of religion is prevalent ones at present. No welfare state, socialist manifesto, however well-intentioned and comprehensive, can satisfy this hunger, the hunger of the spirit.

Jesus insists that God is our provident Father in heaven, so he provides bread from heaven. "The Bread of God is that which comes down from heaven." Here we must stop a while, for we have reached the end of a long preparation. We stand now on a threshold of a climactic revelation. Jesus was preparing for the Jews for this patiently and pedagogically. He multiplied the bread and fed the hungry. He told them to seek food that does not perish. He enlightened them that their Father in heaven, not Moses, who provided the manna their forefathers had eaten. Also, the manna and the loaves He multiplied were only shadowy figures of something greater and better to come. The true bread, Jesus told them, that satisfies mankind, the bread that brings him immortality is the one provided by the heavenly Father.

Here in St. Catherine's, we are invited to focus on the nature of the Eucharistic community. The Eucharistic community, before providing a meal, is a meal. It satisfies, or better, can and should satisfy one of the human spirit's basic hunger: the hunger for fellowship. The Eucharistic community's capacity to provide nourishment and assuage hunger is directly dependent on the quality and solidarity of its being a fraternal fellowship community. This fellowship is brought about and nourished by the Word of God and the Body of Christ. The Eucharist is the Body of Christ. And the Body of Christ is the fellowship of all believers in Christ.

It is not by accident that the Mass has been called the meal of a Christian community. For the hungry Christian is nourished in this meal of the altar. In the first part of the Mass, the liturgy of the Word, the Christian is offered the teaching bread of Jesus present in the Sacred Scriptures readings, especially the Gospel. And this bread of the Gospel must be eaten, assimilated into the very fiber of the Christian. Then, in the Eucharist's liturgy, the Christian is offered the Body and Blood of the Lord, the food that leads into life eternal, the bread of life.

The Eucharistic community, therefore, satisfies man's hunger for truth, justice, for peace. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. He is our righteousness and our peace. The Eucharistic assembly satisfies man's need for love, communion, and fellowship. Gathered by and in the love of Christ, in memory of Christ who loved us and asked us to love one another as He loved us, the Eucharistic assembly knits us into one community. It is the agape---love communion, meal for the hungry. Lord, may You be the answer to all my hunger. Amen.



Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Diocese of Trenton Jewis August 1881 ~ 2021

With gratitude for all we've been given, we ask for God's continued blessings on the parishes and people of our Church family.

Did you know that this August marks the 140th anniversary of the Diocese of Trenton?

In 1881, Pope Leo XIII established the Diocese of Trenton to serve the Catholics of the southern part of New Jersey and named Father Michael J. O'Farrell of New York as its first bishop. At the time, the Diocese had 68 churches, 23 parochial schools and 51 priests spread out across Burlington, Mercer, Monmouth and Ocean Counties, as well as all of the territory that is now part of the Dioceses of Camden and Metuchen.


