FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

My friends, please allow me to share with you the insights and quote from Pope Francis, "Worshipping the Lord means giving Him the place that he must have; worshipping the Lord means stating, believing – not only by our words – that he alone truly guides our lives; worshipping the Lord means that we are convinced before Him that He is the only God, the God of our lives, the God of our history." Given this unprecedented time, I find it interesting that the Church's law distinguishes the "church" and the "parish." The church is a sacred place and space where we worship. The parish is a "certain community of the Christian faithful. For most Catholics, the two are often indistinguishable.

After three months of lockdown due to the public health crisis, authorities gave us the green light to open the church, following and observing all the protocols necessary to be safe. In effect, some of our faithful who really felt the need to come to church to pray and worship are satisfied and happy. Experience shows that coming to church is an essential element of our lives, especially during these challenging times. Similarly, the parish started to provide the faithful's spiritual and sacramental needs as we have the Masses and the congregation's sacraments. We opened the parish office to take care of the faithful and the parish's communication as we respond to the faithful's needs.

As your Pastor, I must repeat my appreciation and give a big word of thanks to every parishioner of our parish. I am most grateful to our parish personnel who, from day one of opening our church and parish, are so committed and diligent with their responsibility, consistently doing their job tirelessly to maintain the safety of all. Kudos to our parishioners who dedicate their time and are extremely generous with their offerings and donations. Without this support of monetary gifts, time, experience, and talent, we could not keep the parish open, vibrant, and active. To all of you, my dearest people of God, my utmost gratitude and immense appreciation. God loves you, as I do.

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's readings are quite fitting for all of us as they are about the importance of hearing properly and listening with the heart. Upon reading and listening to the first reading, the boy Samuel mishears as he lies on his bed. When the Lord calls him, he mistakenly believes it is his guardian Eli calling him. Only after the 3rd call does Eli finally understand that what Samuel is really hearing is the call of God. Samuel's response, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening" indicates the prerequisite for the perfect disciple: a commitment to listening to the voice of God and carrying it out.

In the Gospel, the two disciples of John the Baptist are also in the listening mode. They have committed to following John in response to an inner call from God. And yet now, in effect, John sends them away to listen to the voice of another – Jesus, "the lamb of God." John knows that a deeper listening is needed, that there is someone better to listen to, someone- as John would go on to say – more powerful than he, someone filled with God's Holy Spirit. The two disciples go home with Jesus at about 4 PM and spend the rest of the day listening to him.

It is important to ask how do we become good listeners to the Lord? How do we allow ourselves to become transformed by God's word - by Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh? Most importantly, perhaps, like those two disciples, we need to spend time with the Lord. In doing so, we will find out that it is not a skill; it is simply a commitment, a discipline. However, ordinary human skills can help us tune in to God's voice and allow it to change us. As with listening to another human being, when we listen to the Lord, we need to get rid of distractions, the sound of TV and radio, switching off the phone, etc. The best listening happens when we are alert but attentive. Please keep an open mind and try to set aside preconceived ideas or expectations because it is easy to mishear and misunderstand, imposing our own meanings. And do not interrupt—listening means exactly that.

Remember that communicating with God is not the same as holding a two-way conversation with a human being, but the essentials are the same. It is about the relationship, trust and openness, quality time, and listening with the heart to what is really being communicated. God's word is ultimately a person – Jesus Christ. When we listen to the Lord, when we encounter the Messiah, our lives are changed. Amen.







JAN 22, DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING TO END ABORTION . . .

On Jan. 22, the 48th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision, the Diocese of Trenton will join the other New Jersey (arch) dioceses in observing a Day of Fasting and Prayer to end abortion.

On this day, parishes throughout the Diocese will celebrate the Mass for Legal Protection of the Unborn. In a letter issued Jan. 5, the New Jersey bishops write:

As we mark this tragic event in our nation's history, we remember the millions of lives lost to abortion and pray for the mothers and fathers left to suffer the tragic effects. The Catholic Church is committed to protecting all life from conception to natural death. We will work vigorously to ensure the laws of our state and country protect and defend the intrinsic dignity of all people.

Signed by the bishops of the five Roman Catholic arch(dioceses), as well as two Eastern-rite dioceses, the letter concludes with a prayer:

We humbly implore our Blessed Mother under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas and Protectress of the Unborn, to intercede on our behalf that these efforts to end abortion are guided by mercy, compassion, and above all charity.

IN LIEU OF MARCH FOR LIFE

In keeping with public health recommendations to avoid crowds and closed-in settings due to COVID-19 infection risk, the Diocese and its parishes will not sponsor or organize travel to Washington, D.C., for the National March for Life Jan. 29.

Instead, the Diocese encourages the faithful to keep a

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, <u>he/she is not a member of this parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.




