

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Pope Francis has declared that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God. A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as an annual event but rather a yearlong event instead, for we are urgently needed to grow in our knowledge and love of the Sacred Scriptures and the risen Lord who continues to speak to us through his Word and break bread with us, his faithful people. Mindful of our need to have Christian Unity globally, let us take this opportunity to have our thoughts and prayers for the Jewish people and other faith communities as we strengthen our bonds with them.

We are pleased to inform you of a few parish developments. The Bishop has updated his directives in a time of pandemic and has announced that parishes may now distribute printed materials such as bulletins upon exiting the Church. Unfortunately, missalettes cannot be placed in the pews to be shared or used by others, so we will not have 2021 Pew Missals in the Church. However, a bit of good news that is in keeping with the Bishop's directives, we will offer and encourage our parishioners to order and purchase a 2021 Pew Missal for their personal use. THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

I have a story about an older man in a certain village who goes around begging for his living. As a young man, he was hardworking and well off. Romeo was his only son, the apple of his parent's eyes. They gave him an education above their means. After all, Romeo was their only treasure. He grew into a healthy and handsome young man. But while in college, he got addicted to gambling and to drink. One day he had a brawl with one of his gambling cronies, which ended in murder. Romeo was arrested. The sad news shook the old couple. As a result, there was a long-drawn-out lawsuit that devoured much of their savings. In the end, Romeo was set free., and the parents heaved a sigh of relief. They fervently prayed that at least now Romeo would mend his ways and turn over a new chapter in his life. For a few months, he remained quietly at home. But soon, finding his home restrictive and unexciting, he ran away. Another shock for the old couple. Grief-stricken, they left no stone unturned to trace him, and in the process, they lost all their savings. But all in vain. Now the older man goes around begging, and when he meets someone he trusts, he pleads with tears in his eyes. "Please look for my Romeo. Tell him to come home. Tell him we love him."

The pleas, the prayers reveal a wounded, longing, aching heart, for it expresses a loving father's pain and sorrow. It manifests the deep hurt and disappointment hidden in an older man's heart. He is eager to have his son back and never tired of sending his message of love. God, our Father, has many children. He constantly carries a heavy, wounded heart. Romeo's parents are but one instance of parents whose children are wayward and ungrateful. Their pain and suffering are only a shadow of the pain and sufferings of God the Father. But their sufferings are a small price they pay for sharing in the fatherhood of God. And as no human father can be at peace as long as his son is estranged and away from home. But those pleas, the prayers for him, so too, our heavenly Father keeps on searching for and sending messengers to his estranged and lost sons and daughters.

It is quite clear in salvation history, from creation to consummation. Through the prophets, God, our Father, calls, invites, and pleads with His wayward children to come home. In today's first reading, we see God urging the prophet Jonah to go to His children in Nineveh and, through him, inviting them to come home to be sorry for their sins and be reconciled with their Father. When a child misbehaves, even repeatedly, and feels sorry, what he yearns for and needs most is pardon. His parents or teachers should rise above their sorrowful and aching heart to forgive and pardon him. At this moment, his heart is broken, and only the one whose love for him greater than his offenses can soothe and heal his broken heart. Through what tragedies and even trauma will a child pass if, instead of being understood and loved, he is rebuked and punished? To whom will he then turn for understanding and love? The failings and faults of children test and try their parent's virtues, their heart. What will happen to the children when their parents are found wanting?

Even if a father or mother fails, God assures us He will not fail. He will not be found wanting. The Lord is full of mercy and compassion. St. Paul says: "Who can separate us from the love of God since God has so marvelously proved that He is with us and loves us even to the point of sacrificing His only Son? (Rom.8:31-36) We have to learn to have a large heart from God, whose heart is greater than all our sins, no matter how numerous and grievous they are. All prophets till the last one, John the Baptist, were bearers of God's Good News to the people of God. When John is silenced, Jesus, the Good News in person and action, comes on the scene. When He is silenced, His disciples, even the persecutor Paul, are commissioned to carry His mission to announce the Good News to the broken-hearted, that God is greater than our heart. (1Jn. 3:30) Amen. May God bless you.





Inspiration for the week

"Repent, and believe in the gospel." Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. We have to come to the realization, unless we are happy wallowing in immaturity and superficiality, that the way we have been doing things is not the best or the healthiest. There isn't a human being alive who hasn't acted foolishly or erratically at the cost of almost losing a treasured relationship. "Why did I act that way?" is a question we often ponder after some reflection and enlightenment. Faith works the same way. Stumbling through life and bumping up against meaninglessness, a person can begin to see that something significant is missing. They see that there is merit to a relationship with God and an embrace of faith. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrong doing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God's grace we now see the light.

The faithful are encouraged but not required to attend Sunday Mass in their Parishes whenever possible or to participate in outdoor or live-streamed Masses offered online until the dispensation ceases in order "to keep holy, the Lord's Day."



Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


