### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we have announced, the parish has summer hours that start today as I write this article on July 12, 2021. Our summer hours are Sunday through Thursday, 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM, and closed Friday and Saturday. Even though the hours are temporarily closed to the public, keep in mind our parish staff is busy working on so many important items, including the upkeep of the interior parish complex. Kindly send us an email or call us if you have essential needs, and we will provide you with the services we can happily offer.

The Diocese of Trenton has been so diligent and working so hard for a vocation campaign to the Priesthood. Numerous events, activities, and prayers have been initiated, and we are in full cooperation with the program. It is a fact and a reality to see that we do not have enough priests to serve in Churches. An idea came to our attention of inviting some relatively young priests of the Diocese to say Mass to help with the campaign as they share with the faithful their calling to the Priesthood. Let us hear from them with enthusiasm and excitement. For sure, we will learn and find out from them the true-to-life story of their calling and how they responded to that divine calling.

This Sunday, July 18, 2021, at the 11:30 AM Mass, please give a warm welcome to Rev. Father Andres Alberto Serna as he celebrates the Sunday Liturgy with us. Currently, he is a Parochial Vicar in St. Dorothea-Precious Blood Parishes in Eatontown and Monmouth Beach. Fondly called Rev. Andy, he was ordained to the Sacred Priesthood on June 9, 2012, and currently serving nine years in the ministry. He is originally from Colombia.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Leo and Bobby were active members of the pastoral council. Once, they disagreed on a trivial matter. This was mutually taken as a personal offense. Fed on pride, the heart developed into a festering wound, emitting venom and ill-will. And in no time, an invisible wall of hatred emerged between them. Each took pains to avoid the other. But in their heart of hearts, they knew that the whole thing was ridiculously absurd. All the same, lack of communication made them drift apart, and the wall between them grew higher and thicker. Although they were attending the same Mass, they never thought of the Lord's instruction: "If you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first to be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your sacrifice."

Frank, a college student, was also a member of the council. He noticed the estrangement between Leo and Bobby and its ill effects on the parish council. He determined to heal the wound and bring them closer. So unknown to, but on behalf of Leo, Frank wrote a letter to Bobby apologizing for all that had happened and asking pardon. Bobby, too received a similar letter from Leo. Both were touched and felt ashamed of their silly behavior.

At Mass next Sunday, Frank was delighted to see Leo and Bobby greet each other warmly during the exchange of peace. A broad smile, reflecting the inner joy experienced in the reconciled hearts, shone on their faces. The universal brotherhood of all under God's unique fatherhood is one of the most basic principles of Christianity. All are brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. Specially, all the baptized are brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. As a statement of principle, it sounds so charmingly beautiful. But as a reality, it is so challengingly unattainable, so tragically absent.

Yet, St. Paul emphatically insists, "In Christ Jesus, you who were are far brought near. He has made us both one." To whom does he refer? First of all, to Jews and Gentiles. In Galatians, Paul is more emphatic and universal: "There is no difference between Jews and Gentiles, between slaves and free men, between men and women; you are all one with Jesus Christ." (Gal.3:8)

As Christians, we believe that all are our brothers and sisters in Jesus. Not only should we believe, but we should consider and treat all as brothers and sisters. This makes us another more fundamental question: What makes a person Christian? Indeed it is not one's culture, education or wealth. These breed hostility and cause class distinctions and divisions. But Jesus by His death "broke down the dividing wall of hostility... thereby bringing the hostility to an end." This is our faith, and a person becomes a Christian by faith. We grow and mature as Christians in the measure we grow in our faith. And that faith clearly and emphatically teaches us that there is no difference between Jews and Gentiles, slaves and free, men and women once we are in Christ.

Lord, make us aware of what it means to be a Christian. Amen.







# Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


