

### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

### HAPPY INDEPENDENCE DAY, AMERICA!

This Sunday, the 4th of July, the United States, our beloved nation, observes a federal holiday in honor of the Declaration of Independence. This holiday commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence signed on July 4, 1776, by delegates from 13 American colonies in declaring independence from British rule. Since July 4 this year falls on Sunday, the observed federal holiday is on Monday, July 5. The Declaration of Independence is America's revolutionary Charter of Freedom, and the document established our nation's founding principles.

Thomas Jefferson originally wrote the document, but Benjamin Franklin and John Adams, along with Jefferson, then worked together to make changes. The final draft of the Declaration of Independence was adopted on July 4, but the actual signing of the final document took place on August 2, 1776. While we celebrate with fireworks, barbeque, and other entertainment, let's not forget the freedom that our founding fathers declared to the world over two centuries ago. Let's not forget our history and be thankful to the great men and women who offered their knowledge, gifts of time, and experience, as well as the incredible dedication they contributed to justice, freedom, and democracy. Let us emulate and imitate their loyalty, faithfulness, and bravery for their outstanding achievement for the country and the whole world.

On a personal note, I was sent by the Bishop of Trenton, David O'Connell, to this beautiful parish of St. Catherine of Siena on July 1, 2011. My predecessor retired, and the parish community required a Pastor, so I gratefully succeeded him. Time has flown by rapidly. And believe it or not, I cannot believe that it has been a decade now since I came to St. Catherine. I must be honest and admit that there are so many challenges that I have encountered, and I learned so much. They say that "you should bloom where you are planted," which has always been my guiding line, but most of all, it's my genuine faith in Jesus, the High Priest and Good Shepherd. It takes time, special effort, patience, and endurance to build a solid working team. It takes a village to establish a wonderful group of people who could work together with the same vision and one goal. Allow me then to express my most profound word of THANKS to all, most especially to the group of parishioners who serve in their respective ministries, to my generous parishioners who are always there to support the parish and the diocese financially. And most of all to my dedicated parish staff for their hard work, diligence, care, and love for the parish as they make things happen and get the job done! Finally, a special thanks to my brotherhood, the clergy, for they are always there serving the faithful people of the parish as they preach and minister them wholeheartedly. To the whole parish community, let's continue to work together with joy, compassion, and love. Let us untiringly build the Kingdom of God as the Lord has called us to do. God loves you.

### FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In Today's Gospel, we see Jesus being misunderstood, scorned, despised, and rejected. The rejection is total, covering His teachings and miracles, and His country people abandon him. How can this simple village carpenter, son of Mary, companion of ordinary men like James and John, have so much wisdom and power! They stumbled on the "how can" and not on the fact that Jesus already has them. The facts were plain enough and were staring them in the face, but they still could not understand the "how." One could accept that only in faith, which they lacked. So Jesus marvels at their lack of faith.

Jesus and St. Francis of Assisi enjoy perfect joy (Resurrection and stigmata respectively) through intense suffering. Another form of suffering is the experience of one's weakness. Weakness debilitates us. And we try to overcome it by whatever means necessary. Prayer is one of the means. St. Paul, in the second reading, prays to the Lord to deliver him from his weakness. The Lord answers his prayer with a negative reply containing a positive response. Paul's weakness remains, but God grants the strength to bear it. "My grace is sufficient for you." Once Paul is assured of the sufficiency of grace over his insufficiency and deficiency, he too begins to rejoice in his weakness, hardships, insults, persecutions, etc.

We can trace the same line of thought in the life of the Little Flower. Once, she used to be impatient over her imperfections and minor infidelities. But as she grew mature like Paul, she too realized, "When I am weak, then I am strong." Remember, a child's strength is its parents' strength. The child by itself has no strength. The secret of perfect joy is not the absence of suffering and hardship. Neither is it Buddhist equanimity or stoic willpower. Jesus was a broken man and cried out in agony. Even in His brokenness, He believed in His Father. God is the source and secret of man's joy, his perfect joy. Lord, teach me to accept with faith setbacks and struggles. Amen.



Like St. Martha–the worker for God, the Martha's Ministry of St. Catherine of Siena Church is dedicated to supporting the the church


upkeep of the church environment and the interior housekeeping of our parish complex.



# Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, <u>he/she is not a member of this parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.
