

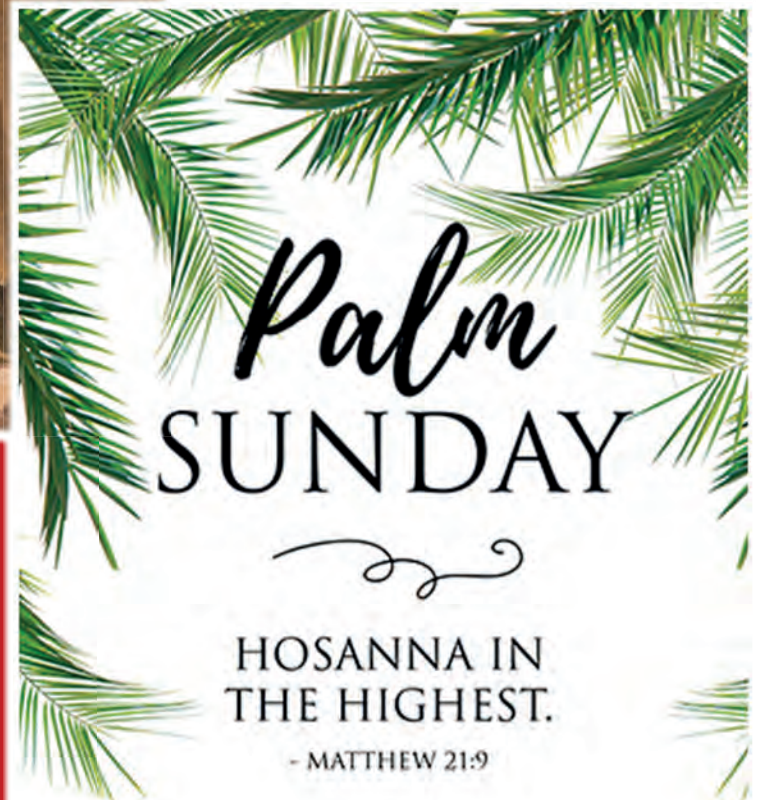

## FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We approach the days of HOLY WEEK this weekend, PALM SUNDAY, Christ's Passion, begins with His royal entry into Jerusalem. As we have announced, blessed palms are available for you to take home after each Mass. Kindly observe and follow our guidelines and directives as we have a slight change in receiving Holy Communion beginning this weekend. Our parish personnel leads the congregation as we approach the Priest or deacon, or extraordinary minister to receive Holy Communion. We want you to celebrate with us; however, keeping you safe and away from sickness and harm generated by the virus is our top concern. Your understanding and cooperation are very much appreciated. Thank you so much.

The royal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is significant. It is a solemn statement about both the person and mission of Jesus. It reveals the paradoxical nature of Jesus' personality. His dichotomy. His divinity. His humanity. It reveals the majesty of His divinity and the dignity of His humanity. What shines more brilliantly is His humility as God. He came to save his people, ironically, they want to silence, ignore, vilify, persecute, and kill Him. Not only does He know them fully well, he has received them as His God-given mission. He referred to it as His baptism, to which He was eagerly looking forward.

Today, Jesus comes to us as King and Lord. He comes as the Prince of Peace, not as a conquering hero. Do we find His presence unbearable? His confrontation embarrassing? Do we look for escape routes of excuses and rationalizations? Jesus wanted to enter Jerusalem and bring lasting peace by reconciling His people with God. But actually, we find Jesus weeping over Jerusalem and its people. In their stupidity, stubbornness, and sinfulness, they did not recognize Jesus and missed the hour of grace. So Jesus wept, shedding tears of love and compassion. Here are some questions to reflect upon:

1. If Jesus were to confront me today, what would be my response?
2. Right now, Is Jesus weeping or rejoicing over me?

### HOLY WEEK

MONDAY of the Holy Week, we have scheduled our daily Mass at 9 AM in the Church. At St. Robert of Bellarmine Church at 7:30 PM, the CHRISM MASS will take place . Attendance will be limited to priests and deacons and invited representatives of the lay faithful. Priests will renew their priestly commitment using cards with formula pre-printed. Due to the COVID pandemic, restrictions are imposed; however, we have the HOLY OILS, newly blessed by the Bishop.

TUESDAY of the Holy Week, we have scheduled our daily Mass at 9 AM in Church as we continue our journey during these holiest days of the year.

THURSDAY of the Holy Week, Mass of the LAST SUPPER is scheduled in Church at 7:30 PM. Washing of the feet is omitted due to the pandemic. The Holy Eucharist's procession at the conclusion of the Mass is omitted. Instead, the Holy Eucharist is placed in the tabernacle for the adoration of the faithful after the post-communion prayer and before the silent departure of the ministers.

GOOD FRIDAY of the Holy Week, Commemoration of the Passion of the LORD JESUS starts at 3 PM in the Church. We are going to read the shorter form of the Passion Narrative. We are not going to sing the Solemn Intercession, and there is an added prayer for an end to the pandemic. We are to remain at our places for the Veneration of the Cross. Once the Cross is brought to the sanctuary, the Priest takes the Cross and, standing in the middle before the altar, invites the faithful to adore the Cross. Due to the pandemic, individual veneration of the Cross by or any physical contact is not allowed. Holy Communion is distributed after the Veneration of the Cross. Please be reminded that our collection for Good Friday is for the Holy Land.

HOLY SATURDAY of the Holy Week, we will not have the blessing of the Food due to the pandemic.

EASTER VIGIL, It Starts at 8 PM. Following the Bishop's directives, no lighting of the Easter fire, distribution of candles to the congregation is omitted. There is no procession of the Paschal Candle. There is only a small amount of water to be blessed that we will dispose reverently afterward. There is NO water in the fonts. We are going to renew our baptismal promises in the usual manner.

## LIVE THE LITURGY

### Inspiration for the week

What an ironic twist of events! Jesus is hailed with palm branches as he comes down a street one minute and faces agonizing suffering and death on a cross the next. Does any of this make any sense? They shouted, "hosanna to our King," out of one side of their mouths and, "crucify him," out of the other. At first glance it seems like such hypocrisy. Yet, when we step back there may be more truth to the story than we care to admit. We struggle with Jesus. We hail him in our churches but struggle to figure out what to do with him on our streets. We are fine when we hear pious renderings of his messages and preaching but wince when it gets to the part about changing the way we conduct business and becoming more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God's name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!

### **Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility**

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

**A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.**

*Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.*
