FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Happy days are yet to come! As we write this article, the weather forecast for this week is exciting and inviting us to work for the season, spring clean up, and, most importantly, experience and savor the beauty and value of life that God the Creator has given us.

A big word of thanks and immense gratitude to our dedicated volunteers, teachers-catechists, aides, and our Religious Education Staff for the beautiful job they have done for our students as they teach, form, and educate our young people. During these challenging times, our parish provided the necessary and essential curriculum for the Religious Education Program utilizing the technology since could not meet in person. We similarly express our appreciation to our parents, who have participated attentively with their wholehearted cooperation for the program's success. We thank the parents as they are the primary educators of the children in the ways of the faith.

As our program is about to conclude for this school year, we are glad to announce that we are about to celebrate First Holy Communion for our First Communicants. The ceremony will be within our Sunday Liturgies together with our faithful congregation. Also, I, as your humble Pastor, will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our candidates. Please keep our First Communicants and our Confirmands in your prayers.

Undeniably, there are lots of things we found out and learned from this Covid-19 pandemic. For one, we have become more conscious and aware that cleanliness is vital in our lives. Removing the clutter and organizing our shelves is crucial to have a healthy and pleasing environment. With that being said, we are announcing that we are going to start a new ministry, called The Martha's Ministry. This a ministry will take care of the parish building complex's interior upkeep which includes the Church, the Offices, the Classrooms, the Hall, and every little corner of the entire building inside. The community is looking forward to establishing the said ministry as we are calling for some volunteers who would step up to the plate and become an essential part of it. PENTECOST SUNDAY

Jesus had shared with His disciples His joys and sorrows. Departing from them, He assured them: "I will not leave you, orphans. I will send you the Holy Spirit, the Comforter." The disciples had to be rooted in and filled with the Holy Spirit to love and serve as Jesus loved and served. The departure of Jesus thus would be felt as little as possible. What mattered, His Spirit would remain. On Pentecost Day, the disciples were emboldened and energized by the Spirit of the Risen Lord. Incorporated thus effectively in the risen Lord, they continue living and loving in the Spirit; they preserved and shared the Spirit of Jesus.

In baptism, we are born as Christians. Confirmation makes us mature Christians. Two commonplace and trite statements. But what are their implications? Despite the charm and fun of childhood, a child should inevitably grow. Otherwise, childhood runs the risk of stagnation. And then all the beauty of childhood is turned into ugliness and its innocence into culpability. No doubt childhood is a beautiful time, but prolonged childhood means immaturity.

Applied to our case, to become a child of God at baptism are a marvelous privilege, great favor, and grace. But the pity is that many of us get stuck at this stage and stagnate. For the disciples of Christ, His physical presence with them was a privilege and a pleasure. Christ compared it to the company of the bride with the bridegroom. But He said that it was advantageous for the disciples that He went away, to send them the Holy Spirit.

The disciples of Jesus became full-pledged apostles, mature and fearless, only after receiving the Holy Spirit. And Jesus asked them explicitly not to launch out into the missionary adventure He had entrusted to them without receiving the Holy Spirit.

A child, as long as it is a child, cannot be held responsible. The apostles act only after receiving the Holy Spirit, after becoming adult Christians. And their acts are recounted in the Act of the Apostles. But the strange fact is that these are more acts of the Spirit than acts of the Apostles. However, there is nothing so odd with reflection since adult Christian life loves and acts in the Holy Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with Your gifts and fruits. Amen.






LIVE THE LITURGY

Religious Education at St. Catherine's Parish Completes Another Year!


In the words of Queen Elizabeth, "this has not been a year filled with undiluted pleasure but we give thanks to our God for all that we have learned."



Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, <u>he/she is not a member of this parish.</u> Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


