FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The holiday we celebrate this last Monday of May is Memorial Day, formally known as Decoration Day. It is the day that we commemorate all men and women in uniform who have died while serving in the military for the United States. It is a time of honor and remembrance. Throughout the country, it is common to visit cemeteries, particularly military ones, and decorate graves of the deceased with flowers, miniature flags, and wreaths. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the usual parades held annually will have some restrictions and observance of the health protocols. With Memorial Day comes the unofficial beginning of the summer season. We are looking forward to these blessed days ahead of us as we pray for the nice weather conducive and comfortable for our summer gatherings and celebrations.

The parish community is happy to congratulate our young children as we start to have their First Communion on June 5 and 6 during our weekend liturgies. Once again, we are profusely thankful to our catechists, parents, and the program staff for their diligent preparation of these First Communicants. Amid this unprecedented time, we are blessed and fortunate to make things happen as we genuinely provide the necessary steps for our children to receive Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time. Congratulations, FIRST COMMUNICANTS.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The greatest mysteries of Christianity are also its summary and epitome. The Holy Eucharist is one of them and the Blessed Trinity is another. Being an absolute mystery, Trinity is beyond human capacity to fathom its depth. However, a deeper understanding of Christianity reveals that in its center stands the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Like a door on its hinges, Christianity rests and revolves around the mystery of the Blessed Trinity. Remove Trinity from Christianity, and what is left? How impoverished Christianity becomes without the Trinity.

The way we approach and appreciate the Holy Trinity is the way Christianity should be approached and appreciated. The Trinity shows us in an eminent way that naked faith is the appropriate approach for the proper appreciation of the Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is not an object for rationalization; it is a subject for prayerful contemplation. The Trinity does not yield to proud intellectual dissection; it is for humble adoration.

Assiduous study and constant reflection on the sacred scriptures that lead to profound personal prayer reveal the mystery of the Trinity as three divine persons bending down lovingly to embrace each of us. Their embrace is as gentle as it is firm, constant, but invisible. The seeming aloofness and coldness of the Trinity then vanishes, yielding place to closeness and warmth, intimacy and affection.

The core of Christianity is love. Understanding love, we can, to a certain extent, understand the Trinity. Trinity, Father, Son, Spirit is loving, sharing, giving. It is community. Trinity within itself is mutual loving, mutual sharing, and giving. It is communion, and it is One. Trinity, outside itself, is loving, sharing, and giving and is communion with us. We know this from the actions of the Trinity towards men revealed in the Bible and from the experience of saints. The keyword to understand the Trinity is LOVE. Love is communication, sharing, communion. The most evident action of the three Divine Person is communication, internal and external.

The Trinity communicates itself to us in creation, redemption, and sanctification, which correspond to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, respectively. The Father denotes the source of life and fount of love that is shared and communicated. Jesus Christ is the greatest and the most important communication of the Father. God so loved the world that He sent His only Son. God the Son communicates in love. No one loves more than the One who lays down His life for His friends, says Jesus. He did that for us.

And He gave us His own Spirit. Another powerful communication. The Holy Spirit is again communication of and in love. Himself called the gift of the Father and the Son, and the Holy Spirit is also the Giver of gifts. His seven gifts are His seven modes of communication. God is love, and God gives of himself. And shares spontaneously for love has to be shared. A self-enclosed love is not genuine. Because God the Father loves, the result is God the Son. The Son loves the Father, and the product is the Holy Spirit. The Blessed Trinity is the best proof that God is unconditional love. O Holy, Blessed Trinity, Blessed Communication in love, lead me to deeper communication with You. Amen.





Inspiration for the week

The immensity, scope, intimacy, and pervasiveness of God's presence is too intense for the human mind. We often limit God by our expectations of Him and have a hard time just letting God be God. ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE NEW JERSEY BISHOPS Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

At this time, due to the observance of public safety protocols and the increase in the availability of vaccines, we have begun a return to some sense of normalcy in various sectors of our society.

Therefore, we the Catholic Bishops of New Jersey, are lifting the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Days Mass obligation beginning on Saturday, June 5, 2021, and Sunday, June 6, 2021, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We welcome the Christian faithful to return to the regular participation in the Sunday Eucharist, the source and summit of our Catholic faith (cf. Code of Canon Law canon 1247 and Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2180).

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions. One should consult the local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass (canon 87).

Finally, safety protocols (such as wearing masks, social distancing, etc.) and liturgical directives in each New Jersey Diocese remains in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.



Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.
