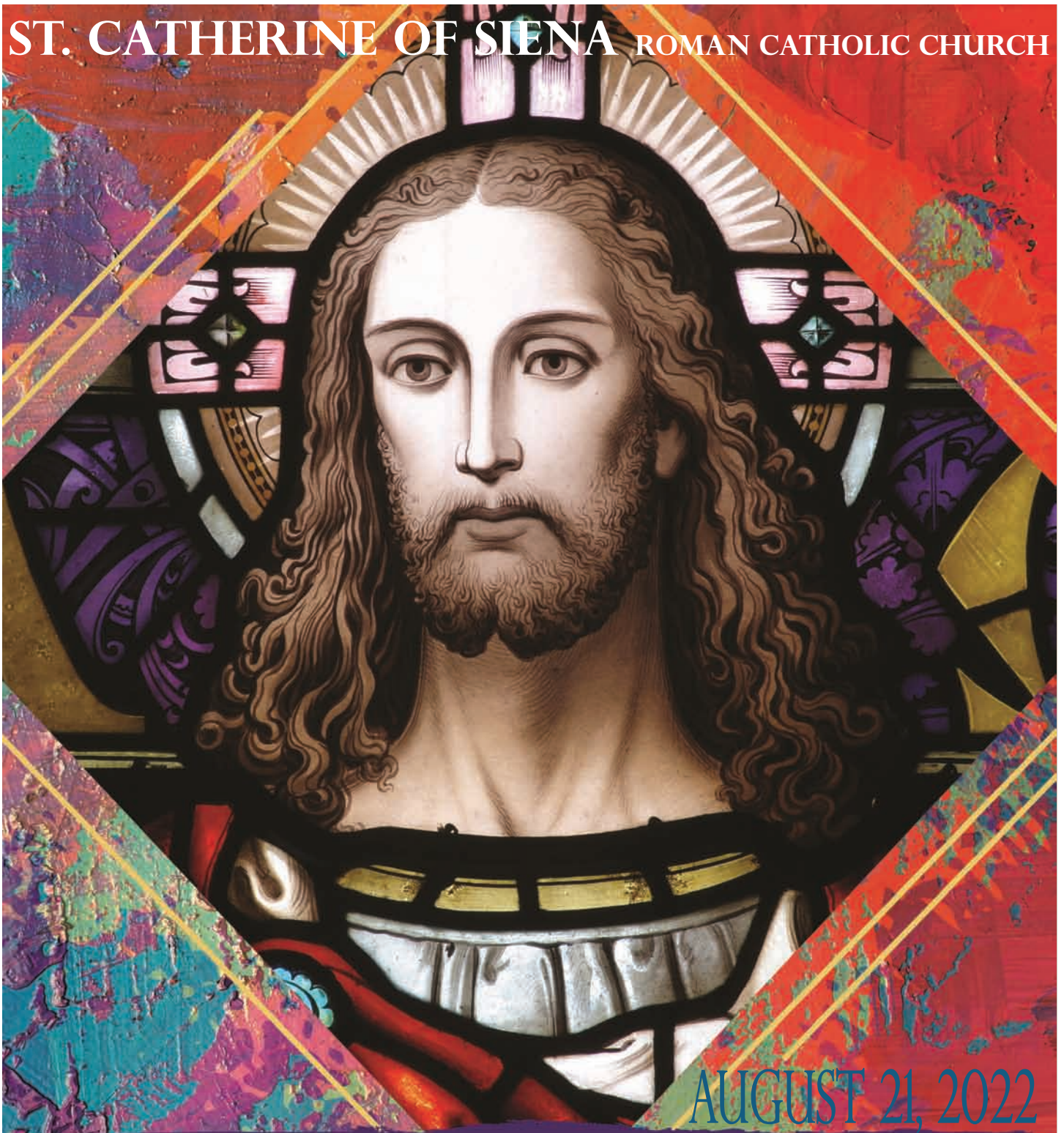

A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Have you noticed that when we come to some magnificent building with a broad, impressive doorway, entry into that building seems easy? Yet, we would probably only be visiting that place for a brief period. To enter a building, which belongs to that place, needs more than a grand entrance. We need to find some indication that this is a place we belong, a place that has been prepared for us. Perhaps this is behind the idea of the narrow door that Jesus asks us to enter through. How narrow is it? Just as narrow as we are because it fits us and no one else.

What that doorway means in our lives is something we must discover for ourselves. It probably means accepting some sacrifice in our lives. Our lives are limited, and that is as it should be. We waste a lot of time and energy thinking of the things we do not have; things we haven't done and miss what is laid out before us. The grand doorway, the magnificent arch we might want to walk through, can give us the delusion that we are great, as the entrance is great. The small way teaches us humility but also shows us that we enter the kingdom through a doorway shaped by God just for us.

Experience would tell us that the easiest way to get lost is to join a great crowd of people who seem to know where they are going. The crowd can make us feel safe, but in the masses of people we can get lost. More worryingly, they might be going to the wrong place for us. Yet we won't feel lost because so many people surround us, and we don't have any decisions for ourselves. Jesus speaks to the crowds in the Gospels, but they don't listen. It is the few individuals whom he encounters who seem to change their lives.

For this is why we must have personal prayer in our lives. We are called to take personal responsibility. We need to be one of the people who stand before Christ and look for our salvation from him. After that, we may have companions on the way. They can be challenging too. But our companionship with them can also be an essential part of our journey of discipleship.

The Prophet Isaiah is trying to teach this message by listing the various means of transport that those who will come to Jerusalem will use. The Jerusalem that Christians believe in, the place where the world will be gathered, is not the physical city of Jerusalem, but it is accurate enough. To this city, many will come from across the globe and throughout the world ages. They are drawn toward the place of life. The journey will be completed by those who do not look too far ahead. They will not ask how many will be saved but only ask themselves the more straightforward questions: "What must I do now?" "What choices must I make now?" "What is my next step?" Even those questions may not always have an answer. In that case, we need to wait in prayer. It will soon become clear enough for us to be able to take another step. Amen.

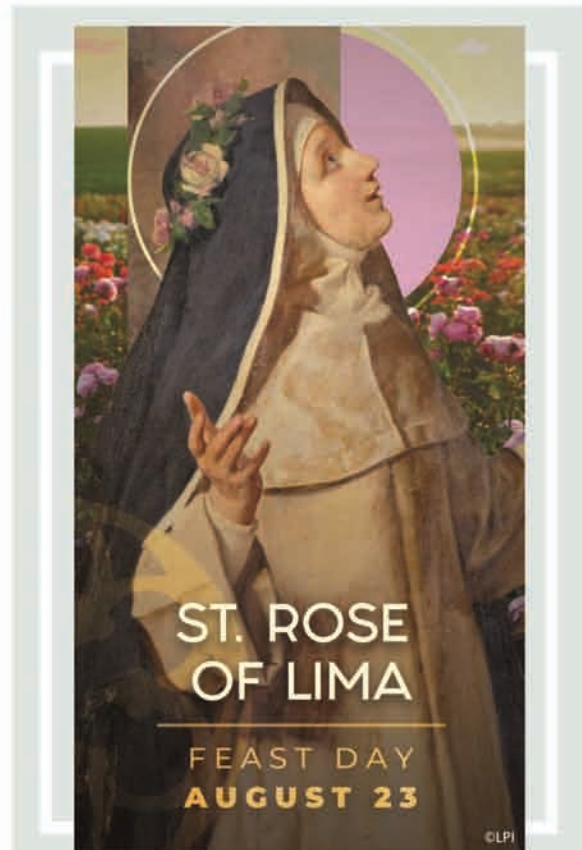

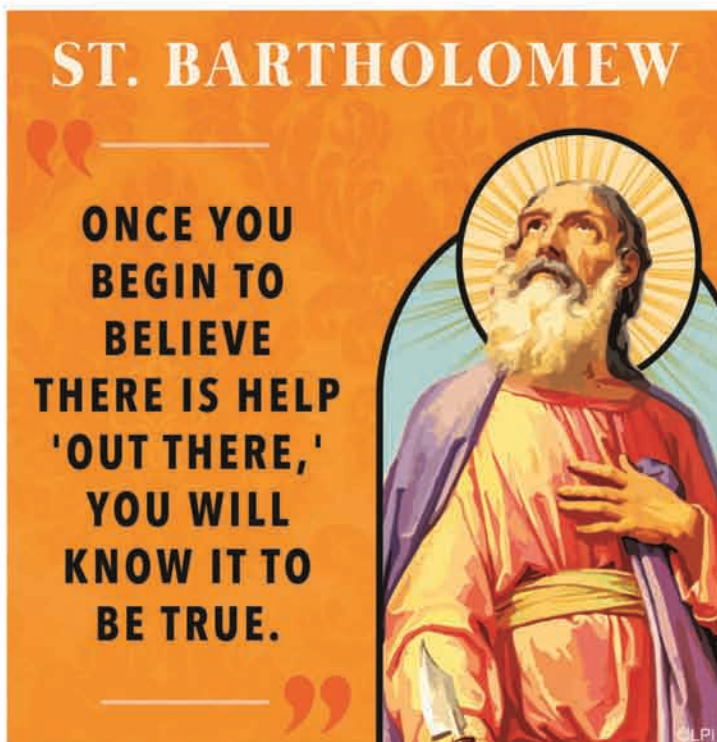

Saint of the Week

Born Isabel Flores de Olivia in April 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, Saint Rose of Lima took the name Rose at her confirmation in 1597. Legend holds that she received this nickname as an infant because a servant saw her face transformed into a rose.

Even as a child Saint Rose was dedicated to Christ. Growing up she made many secret penances. And when she was old enough to be married, deterred suitors by cutting off her hair and rubbing pepper on face to make it blister. She took a vow of chastity even though her parents wished her to marry. She fasted many times a week and permanently abstained from meat. Eventually her parents gave in and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic, although she was not permitted to live in a convent. Saint Rose undertook severe penances, allowing herself only two hours of sleep a night in order to have more time to pray, wearing a heavy silver crown with spikes on the inside imitating Christ's crown of thorns, and even burning her own hands. However, she also cared for the sick and hungry, and sold her beautiful embroidery and fine lace, as well as flowers she grew to help raise funds for the poor. She died at the age of 31 on August 24, 1617. Pope Clement X canonized her in 1671, she was the first saint of the New World, born in the Americas. Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines.

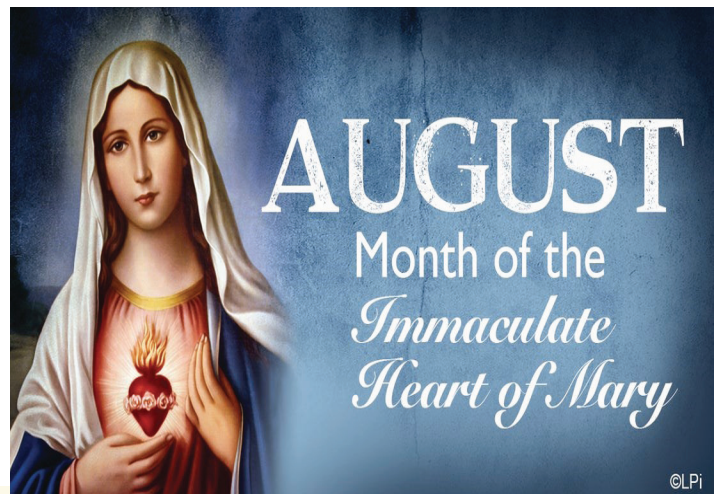

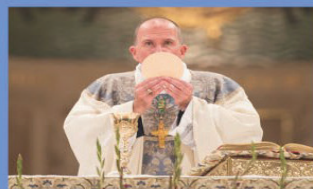
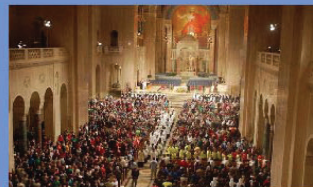

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

First-time parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.

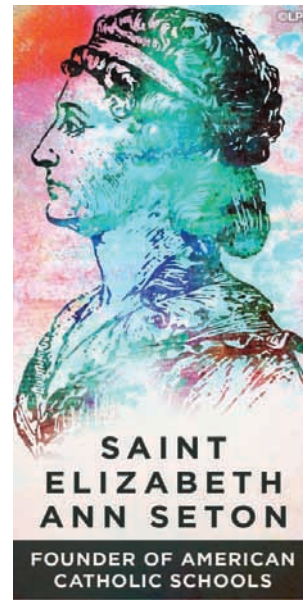
Celebrate Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton

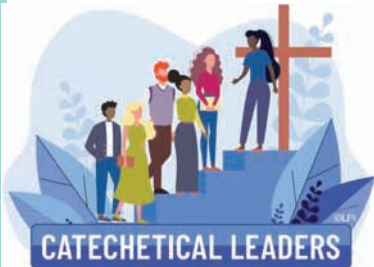

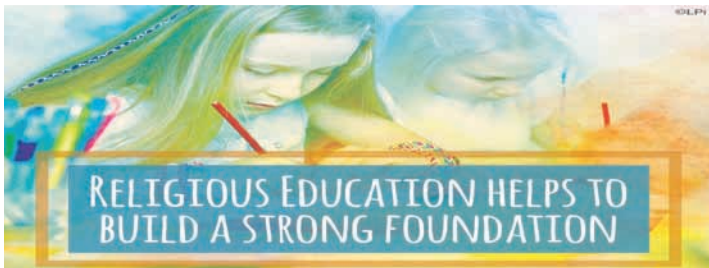
BECOME A CATECHIST
