A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope everyone is enjoying their summer, visiting and gathering family members and friends, getting in touch and connecting with people who make a difference, for this keeps us active and happy. We have to see and experience the beauty of life all the time. Life is to be lived! Yes, there are some struggles and knocks, but we have to face and deal with them, look for some remedies, and most importantly, call on God for his divine assistance.

On a different note, we know that pretty soon, our kids have to go back to school and keep in mind that there has to be some balance with their education, specifically about their faith. We are receiving phone calls and accepting a good number of new parishioners from all over the state. The parents are enrolling their young ones in the Religious Education Program. Having mentioned that, we appeal to your kind-hearted participation as there's a great need for help in teaching our faith and learning more about Jesus, the Church, and the Sacraments to our children. Please be reminded that the first and best faith teachers to the children are their parents, most notably their mother. We are looking for more volunteer catechists and aides for the Program. NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Most of Jesus' followers were poor people who struggled daily to make a living. His teaching on selling their possessions and giving money to poor people must have amazed them. They were poor, weren't they? So why not keep the money to support themselves?

The answer lies in what Jesus says about remaining alert and prepared for the coming of salvation. He is talking of where our heart truly is and, therefore, our most profound consciousness. If we occupy our minds entirely with the attachment to things or people, that can betray a profound lack of trust, and we will have little space for developing a mind and heart in tune with God's vision for the world. Being a "cheerful giver" is evidence not only of generosity but of courage. It is evidence that our deepest hope lies in God and not in money, power, or any other means dominating our surrounding world. Pope Benedict XVI, in his encyclical on hope, Spe Salvi, said that "the one who has hope lives differently." This Gospel is Jesus' invitation to us to live differently, with a different set of values that put the love of God, others and transformative action in the world before the baubles of fame, power, and fortune. We can live confidently and without fear when we have become free from all forms of internalized idolatry. For Jesus, freedom comes from knowing what to set our hearts on to live fully. Praying, what St. Ignatius of Loyola called the Examen, or Examination of Conscience, daily is a helpful way of recognizing what is pulling us towards God or turning us away. It's about knowing where our treasure lies and building our relationship with Jesus to be more potent than our fears.

When Jesus challenges us to give in a way that supports and transforms the lives of others, he is talking of what it truly means to believe that we are one body with him. For what we do to the least of his brothers and sisters, we do to him. This is the building up of the kingdom. A kingdom to which all are invited as transformers of the world and "revolutionaries of tenderness." This kind of generosity is not just going through the motions but giving away part of ourselves. By doing so, we receive ourselves back from the hands of "the least," who is the mirror of Christ. Whatever we do for them, we do for him and vice versa. Our anxieties and fears are transformed into hope when we let go of needing to control everything. To live this transformative faith, hope, and love, we need to become alert to the signs of Christ's presence on earth. The more we become aware of him in all areas of our life, the more he shows us what it is to be fully and genuinely human. Amen.





Saint of the Week

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal was born to a noble family in Dijon, France, on January 28, 1572. Her mother died when she was an infant. Her father raised her and provided for her education. In 1592 She married the Baron de Chantal, the couple were devoted to each other. They had six children, three of whom died in infancy. As Baroness, Saint Jane Frances restored the custom of daily Mass, and was famous for her charitable works. Unfortunately, her husband died in a hunting accident only eight years after their marriage. Devastated Jane Frances was forced to live in her father-in-law's strict household where she took a vow of chastity.

In 1604 while visiting her father in Dijon, she met Saint Francis de Sales and he became her close friend and spiritual director. Although not many of their epistles have survived, the pair had a lively correspondence which lasted until Saint Francis died.

Under the direction of St. Francis de Sales and with his partnership she established the Congregation of the Visitation at Annecy in 1610. This was a unique order, without the extreme ascetical practices typical in other religious orders, accepting women and girls and those rejected by other orders because of poor health or age. The new order was also unusual in its public ministry, rather than a strictly cloistered life. Saint Jane transformed her convent at Annecy into a hospital during the plague of 1628.

The saint died at the Visitation Convent in Moulins on December 13, 1641. At the time of her death, there were 86 convents of Visitation nuns. She was canonized in 1767 by Pope Clement XIII.

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.


