

### A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

### FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD JESUS

Through His baptism and His penitential attitude, Jesus ultimately identified Himself with the common man. He has taken the place of sinners that we are. He demonstrates His solidarity with all humanity. It was an act of self-abasement. Jesus' baptism fore-told His suffering, death, resurrection, and the Holy Spirit's Descent. As John has put it, "He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

At the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, the Father makes known to all who Jesus is, His own Beloved Son. He presents His Son as the beloved. The Father reveals the identity of His Son and the intimate relationship that they enjoy.

The response of Jesus is very inspiring. Through prayer, Jesus sought companionship with his Father. Above and beyond all human companionship, Jesus knew that only God could know, meet and satisfy the depth of His soul. Jesus was not praying for any specific favor from the Father. He just wanted to feel again and again the immense expansion of His soul who would never experience in moments when in communion with His Father. He was deeply aware that there was a Companion who would never fail, no matter how much His human companions would fail Him.

In baptism, each one of us is accepted by God as his beloved son or daughter. We are His adopted sons and daughters. In baptism, God said the same things about us: "This is My beloved son/daughter." We have become a new creation, and the Spirit of God is within us. Jesus said His 'Yes' to the Father and frequently sought companionship with his Father through prayer. We, too, are called to say 'Yes' to the Father and build up our relationship with Him by repeating and living our 'Yes.'

Baptism marks the inauguration of the messianic life of Jesus. He becomes the faithful servant of God, as foretold by Prophet Isaiah. Jesus began His ministry and proclaimed the kingdom of God to the people who walked in darkness and confusion. He worked for the cause of religious, social, economic freedom,

and justice. He became the light of the world that was filled with the darkness of sin and division.

He became a perfect leader who identified with the deepest longings and wishes of the people of all time. He showed the way to the Father, the final destiny of man. He loved people and worked for their liberation. For this, He had to face violent resistance from the opposing forces. He never gave up His mission but laid down His life for the sake of truth, justice, and love.

It is this life of Christ that we share in our baptism. We are called to complete transformation through the sacraments of baptism. For baptism opens the door to a new life, a life of love and service in Christ. We rise to a life set apart for Christ and our fellow human beings. Baptism is the aversion to sin and conversion to God. It is a rebirth, as St. Paul says in Colossians, chapter 3.

Thus, today's feast presents Jesus as the accurate model of the new life we receive in the Sacrament of baptism. We are true Christians if we can radiate the light of Christ to the people around us. We live in a world torn by religious fanaticism, extremism, and violence. Humanity is facing the great threat of war, terrorism, and complete annihilation. There is anxiety, fear, and helplessness in the lives of human beings.

In this context, the Spirit of Christ that we received at baptism should shine out to dispel the darkness of the world. We are called to be the light and the salt of the earth. The flame of love and service kindled at our baptism is to be protected from the wind of hatred, jealousy, and war. This flame has to spread and shine out worldwide through baptized Christians. The Church of the baptized should penetrate the deepest problems of humanity with the light of Christ. This is the true meaning of baptism.

May my heavenly Father's affirmation: "You are My beloved Son" sink deep into my consciousness. Amen.

in bodily form like a dove. (Lk 3:22)




### **OBSERVANCES FOR THE WEEK OF JANUARY 9, 2022**

### Saint of the Week

Born a pagan, St. Hilary (c. 315 – c. 367) studied philosophy and the meaning of life, eventually making his way through the bible. He became a convert and was appointed bishop of Poitiers in 353. Sometimes referred to as the Hammer of the Arians, St. Hilary defended the Nicene Creed against a popular heresy, Arianism. He was exiled to Phrygia for opposing Roman emperor Constantius II, who preferred the heresy which denies Christ's divinity. From Phyrgia St. Hilary fought with his pen, zealously writing against the heresy.

Eventually he was allowed to return to Poitiers, but did so by a circuitous route, preaching against Arianism all the way. St. Hilary was likely the first writer of hymns in the West, his writings on the Trinity, Psalms and Gospel of Matthew survive today. St. Hilary was created Doctor of the Church, a title given to those who provided important contributions to theology and doctrine, in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.



### SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

## Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

### A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Registering a parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name.
