A Message from Fr. Angelito


Dear Friends in Christ,

On behalf of the whole parish family of St. Catherine of Siena, we welcome His Excellency, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., D.D., as he will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to our 29 candidates on May 31, Tuesday at 4 PM in the Church. May I ask for your thoughts and prayers to our young people as they receive the Gifts of the



Holy Spirit and become more assertive in their faith and belief to be manifested in their lives and attitudes.

Allow me to thank Bishop David for his presence and, most importantly, for gracing the occasion as the Minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation for our young people in the parish. Also, we are so grateful to our Religious Education staff and dedicated volunteers who worked so hard to make this event remarkable and successful. We are so thankful for our music ministry as she provided us with liturgical music to add more solemnity and enhance the spiritual celebration. Thank you so much, the Knights of Columbus, who are so generous with their efforts and time.



FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Jesus Christ, our Savior, has opened for us the portals of heaven. His ascension is the crowning of his mission. He has gone ahead of us to prepare a place, "Come, follow Me." St. Paul says, "Those whom He called he also justified." His firm conviction is that if we have died with Christ, we shall also rise with him in glory.

In baptism, we died with Christ and rose with Him. In his letter to the Colossians, St. Paul exhorts us: "If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where

Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth." As we commemorate the event of the Lord's ascension to heaven, let our hearts also go up with Him.

We all claim to be followers of Christ, but sometimes we lack confidence in Him. When He calls us to take up our daily crosses, we are afraid, and we drawback. Do we believe that at the other end of the way of the cross -eternal glory awaits us?

Christ has accomplished his work, sent the Holy Spirit to watch over the Church, and returned to the Father. Yet He is ever with us in the form of the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the homeless, etc. If we believe in loving and serving Christ in these needy brethren, then He who is blessed at the right hand of the Father will tell us, "O blessed of my Father, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world." Our permanent home is in the Kingdom of the Father. God has created us to be there with Him one day. But here on earth, we should prepare ourselves in mind, will, and heart for eternal paradise. Life has trials, challenges, and pains, but happiness is the one who goes through them with the genuine love of God and neighbor. He will receive his crown.

Today, as the Church invites us to celebrate the ascension of Jesus to the right hand of His Father, we must not look upon Him as being far away from us. Indeed, Jesus has now gone back to where He came from, but He also lives on among us. He continues to be born, live, and die in us, his followers.

There are many people today who do not believe in Jesus. Jesus wants us to bear witness to his presence in the world. These people will not believe unless they see him and touch him, in and through us. "You must be my witnesses, "says Jesus to us. We are his witnesses if, despite living in difficult and dangerous circumstances, we continue to trust in God and live according to his will.

Lord God, may my life be a convincing witness to You and grant me the grace that it may never be a counter-witness. Amen.



Saint of the Week

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH


Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.






