

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Light, enlightenment, seeing, vision, are all themes of today's liturgy. All these are preludes to faith. In today's first reading, like David, without any personal merit, we have been chosen and gifted by God with faith to 'see' and to be the light of the world.

St. Paul in the 2nd reading recalls that we used to be in darkness, "but since you have become the Lord's people, you are in the light and must live like people who belong to the light."

Faith brings light; faith *is* light. All those who live their faith, especially adult converts, experience their gift of faith as a gift of light. In today's Gospel we have the touching story of a man groping in the darkness of blindness and reaching the realm of light.

Today's story, like that of the Samaritan woman of last Sunday, is story of journey, of an encounter in faith. In her case she had, before making her act of faith, to overcome a number of personal difficulties. The blind man, on the contrary, is eager and courageous to believe. However, he must surmount many social difficulties. Insult, abuse, threat and even excommunication are his lot for believing in Jesus. He believes in Jesus' word and obeys it. Perhaps he did not know what would be the consequences of obeying Jesus. But he is humble enough to obey. He goes to the pool and washes and able to see. It is a pleasant surprise. He experiences great joy. From a world of darkness he is suddenly transported to a world of light.

The blind man's physical healing, his gift of sight, is a symbol of his gift of faith. At first Jesus is for him only 'the *man* called Jesus'. Later Jesus for him is a *prophet*. Finally, Jesus is for him *Lord* and he confesses, kneeling down, "I believe, Lord." The blind man is healed both physically and spiritually.

The whole import of the story comes out only in the last verse when Jesus says, "If you were blind, then you would not be guilty; but since you claim that you can see, this means that you are still blind." Jesus is taking a dig at the Pharisees who claimed to know everything, everything about Jesus, which made them blind. This is self-imposed blindness and therefore it is blameworthy. Refusing to believe, one condemns oneself to darkness, deprives oneself of the gift of faith and light.

Lord, grant me the grace to see myself. Amen.




Prayer for Venerable Aloysius Schwartz's intercession







Lenten Regulations

February 1, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, until Holy Thursday morning, April 6, 2023 ---* the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. ALL OTHER FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of ABSTINENCE.

The pastor of a parish has the faculty to give a dispensation to <u>individual</u> parishioners in his parish and the Diocesan Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat): this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 25-26, 2023, to Trinity Sunday, June 3-4, 2023.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those who are conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.




Draw a cross and put it in a place where you can see it and think of Jesus every day.


