

In the First Reading, the same thing happened to the people who "added infidelity" and ended up May God bless you, being captive in Babylon. And St. Paul described Father Angelito

himself and his Christian converts as those who "were dead in our transgressions." We, too, are so often people who do not see new possibilities and settle down in captivity of our daily routine activities. But during darkness, amid the total absence of possibilities because of our fear, there

Jesus knew that his life was in danger, but he did not run in fear and distress. The religious leaders caught him and executed him. When we look up at the crucified, what story do we receive? 
Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week



SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

HYMN OF THE WEEK - Amazing Grace Text: John Newton 1725-1807 Music: New Britain Test 86.86. Common Meter

John Newton was a commander of a slave ship which encounter a severe storm in 1748. He vowed to God that if he came through this storm he would devote his life to the Church. He was ordained by the Church of England in 1764 and composed several hymns. The text of Amazing Grace was set to the tune of New Britain and published in 1829 in the hymnal Columbian Harmony. The hymn speaks of the transformative power of God's saving grace as in Ephesians 2:8-9 "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast."





Sharing the Gospel




