

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today at 11:30 AM Mass, we are going to have the Third Scrutiny for our RCIA catechumen elect. We are requested to pray fervently for him as he will be given a spirit of repentance, a sense of sin, and true freedom for being a child of God. For this Mass, take note that the Gospel Reading for the Third Scruting (5th Sunday of Lent) is taken from Cycle A, Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

We pointed out that Lent is not all about a period of doing penance and feeling sorrow for our sins only but a period in which we must renew ourselves, create new initiatives and possibilities, and this includes making choices which can be painful. Lent is a period of entering into a new life which involves dying and being resurrected. Excitement about new life, letting go of the old and being reborn, belong together. Lent is a period in All of us should experience a spiritual gift of life, dying, and being resurrected.

John, the evangelist, his first story is the wedding celebration at Cana where Jesus gives that strange answer to Mary upon her request to take care of the wine, "My hour has not only yet come." What follows is a series in which people may celebrate because they receive the gifts of salvation: bread and wine, healing and forgiveness, peace and love. anything else is to betray creation." Such a commitment to life does imply a cost, and Jesus had to pay dearly for having set people free from the burden of political and religious oppression. The hour had come, tells John... Jesus was "troubled now." Suffering and death were unavoidable, but the Jesus on the cross in John is already glorified and risen, and being risen, he can entrust Mary, symbol of the Jewish people, to the beloved disciple, John, symbol of a new people that is born through Jesus' ministry, suffering and death.

In John's Gospel, Jesus does not give up the spirit—he passes on his spirit to a people of Jews and Greeks; in John, the Church is born, not at Pentecost, but on the cross----"I have glorified it and will glorify it again.

The gift of being fully alive---of dying of one's old self---and being resurrected belong together.

which we walk with our master, Jesus of resurrection during Lent. "Life is for the living, Nazareth, experiencing and enjoying a new for those who intend to keep on living, whatever the cost, because to do anything else is to betray creation." Excitement seldom comes unhidden to a life. If we want to put excitement back into our lives, we must be willing to put it ourselves. It is so easy to die before we have ever begun to live." "What does it take to put excitement back into life?" The answer is a simple one, "It takes me doing something I have never done." Let us look for some we have never done before---- it will make Lent exciting. Amen.







SPONSORSHIP FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but</u> now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of <u>this parish</u>.

Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

prior to scheduling the Baptism.

Godparents are required to provide Sponsor Certificates before a Baptismal date is given.



Sharing the Gospel

When you act bossy, selfish, or rude, no one will want to spend time with you. You will be lonely and unhappy. Follow the example of Jesus instead. Be strong in your faith. Do all that God asks you to do, even when it is not easy. Be honest. Be kind. Share what you have been given. Be helpful. Forgive.

Show everyone what God is like. When you follow Jesus' example, you won't be lonely. When people around you see that your faith is real, they will come to you for help. They will want to know what makes you different. Then you can point them to Jesus.

Mission for the Week

Look for ways to be helpful in your family. Help set the table. Take the trash out. Put away your toys and books without being asked. When your family notices you being so helpful, tell them you are trying to follow Jesus' example.
