

OUR PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend is the kick-off for the 2025 Annual Catholic Appeal. As a parish community we are going to watch the video of Bishop O'Connell presenting to us all about the appeal, what it is for, why do we do it, and how do we do it. The parish' goal last year (2024) was \$40,000.00 which we achieved, and we are receiving a rebate of \$11, 192.00.



Sixth Sunday in Ordinary time

Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation on the call to holiness in today's world is entitled Gaudete et Exsultate meaning "Rejoice and leap for joy" (Lk. 6:23)--- taken from Jesus' proclamation of the Beatitudes. "Beatitude " comes from the Latin *beati*, which translates the original Greek *makairoi*. They refer to the state of happiness or blessedness. The Beatitudes which are found in Matthew (5:3-11) and

Luke (6:2026) are often referred to as: the Gospel within the Gospel." They lie at the core of Jesus' proclamation of the Kingdom of God. In Luke's Gospel which also gives us the corresponding "woes," they are the opposite of being in the condition of wealth, satisfaction, and being held in honor.

Pope Francis writes that there can be a number of theories about what constitutes holiness, with various explanations and distinctions, but nothing is more enlightening than turning to Jesus' words and seeing his way of teaching the truth. And in the Beatitudes, Jesus with great simplicity, speaks of what it means to be holy. And the word "happy" or "blessed" becomes a synonym of holy.

In a way, all the beatitudes are contained in the first one: "Blessed are you who are poor." Those who are convinced of their own weakness and sinfulness, those who acknowledge that whatever they possess, life, health, intelligence, money, goods, etc., are not really theirs but given to them by God are blessed.



PARISH SACRAMENTAL LIFE



Baptism

Baptism is the foundation of the Christian Life. It marks the beginning of the life of faith and incorporates a person into the Body of Christ.

For infant baptism, parents of the child should be registered members prior to requesting the Sacrament. A Baptism class is required for first-time parents. Godparents are required to submit sponsor certificates before a date is given. Please call the parish office for scheduling.

Holy Matrimony

Marriage is a union of love and a response to God's call to holiness. The love of husband and wife becomes the symbol of God's love on earth.

Arrangements must be made at least one year prior to the wedding date. Must be a registered parishioner and attending Mass for 6 Months.

Anointing of the Sick

The primary effect of this Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick receive peace and courage to deal with the difficulties of illnesses or frailty.

Contact the parish office for scheduling a visit to the sick.

For an emergency, call 732-938-5375 and follow the instructions.

SPONSORSHIP

FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives</u> <u>elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.</u> <u>Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose</u> <u>territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained. Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation & if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life & support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.



Inspiration for the Week:



STATIONS OF THE CROSS, EXPLAINED!

In the earliest years of Christianity, the locations central to the story of Holy Week — the Garden of Gethsemane, Calvary, the Holy Sepulcher, and more — were destinations for pilgrims who wanted to experience Christ's sacrificial love for us in a physical way. In the years after the Crusades, pilgrimage to the Holy Land became impossible for most Christians, and the Stations of the Cross was popularized as a devotional means to pray through the passion and death of Christ.

Throughout history the number of stations has varied, with different traditions focusing on different events. In the 18th century, the number was officially fixed at 14 by Pope Clement XII. These stations are taken from the Gospel accounts of Christ's passion and death, though there are several which are derived from tradition and apocryphal sources, such as the meeting of Mother and Son and St. Veronica wiping the face of Christ.





ARE YOU REGISTERED at **ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA** PARISH?

We welcome all people to our parish and are delighted each time new members join our faith community. If you recently moved to the area or if you are long-time resident, please consider registering. This information is most helpful for us in providing pastoral care to you and your family.

Your parish registration is also necessary when you may be asked to submit a "certificate of eligibility" to serve as a godparent/ sponsor. If we do not have vour registration information then this can become a difficulty. We cannot issue a sponsorship certificate if you are not a registered, active parishioner for six months.

How do you register? You can come by any time we are open to fill out the parish registration form or call the Parish Office to check your status.
