

# **OUR PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION**

#### Dear Friends in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Jesus transformed failure into a booming success in the professional lives of the disciples. The disciples worked the whole night on the sea but caught nothing. But when Jesus entered the scene, they had a bumper catch. In the

from failure to success, there are three phases:

**The disciples experienced failure**. We heard that the disciples had worked all night trying to catch fish but were fruitless. They were professional fishermen who knew their trade well, yet they failed. Even after genuine efforts, failure is bound to happen in our lives. Most successes are built on a multitude of failures. Someone said, "Many of life's failures are men and women who did not realize how close they were to success when they gave up." Next time you fail, do not get disheartened; rise and try again.

# The disciples experienced a delay in the divine help.

Jesus did not help the disciples immediately. After fruitlessly working the whole night, they had moored their boats and washed their nets. Then Jesus got into one of the boats and began to teach the people. We do not know how long He taught them, but Jesus addressed Peter and his associates' problems only after finishing His teaching.

From Jesus' attitude, we need to learn two lessons: 1.) Listening to God's word must precede God's blessings. The people and the disciples had to hear His teaching before they had to witness a miracle. 2.)God works at His own pace. Jesus does not address Peter's problem immediately. The disciples had returned from the sea, and they had already tied their boats and were washing their nets. Only later, He did address Peter's problem. We cannot expect or force God to work at our pace.

The disciples obeyed Jesus' command. After Jesus had finished preaching, He said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let your nets for a catch." Peter made a professional objection, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing." There was very little chance of getting any fish when the sun's rays were glinting on the surface of the water.

As the disciples were lowering their nets, a single idea rang in their minds, "At thy word, we will let the nets down." Even when things look dismal in life, and all our efforts seem to fail, heeding Jesus' words would tilt the balance in our favor.

When we work, we need to keep our hearts close to the Lord and listen to His voice calling us – wearied or not wearied, beaten or not beaten before, and do as He bid us – 'Put out into the deep water, and we shall not toil in vain.' Amen.



These brothers by birth became brothers in mission. Cyril and Methodius were born to a Greek diplomat in the 800s. The two brothers served in local governmental posts before each withdrew to a monastery. Their lives changed when the political leadership in Eastern Europe - what is now Ukraine - requested priests who spoke the native Slavic languages. Cyril and Methodius had proven themselves as able administrators and holy men, so they were sent as missionaries. First, Cyril invented an alphabet. This became the foundation for what is now used today and is still called the Cyrillic alphabet! Next, the brothers translated the Gospels, the Psalms, and other liturgical books into the native language of the people. Their work spread across Eastern Europe. God indeed raises up saints for their times!

# PARISH SACRAMENTAL LIFE



### **Baptism**

Baptism is the foundation of the Christian Life. It marks the beginning of the life of faith and incorporates a person into the Body of Christ.

For infant baptism, parents of the child should be registered members prior to requesting the Sacrament. A Baptism class is required for first-time parents. Godparents are required to submit sponsor certificates before a date is given. Please call the parish office for scheduling.

## Holy Matrimony

Marriage is a union of love and a response to God's call to holiness. The love of husband and wife becomes the symbol of God's love on earth.

Arrangements must be made at least one year prior to the wedding date. Must be a registered parishioner and attending Mass for 6 Months.

### Anointing of the Sick

The primary effect of this Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick receive peace and courage to deal with the difficulties of illnesses or frailty.

# SPONSORSHIP

# FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine's, you must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives</u> <u>elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish.</u> <u>Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose</u> <u>territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained. Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation & if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life & support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.


### **DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!**


### <u>Share the Gospel</u>


